



discussion was focused on an idea to allow for the Stone House to be sold to a private entity for use as commercial space. This may include demolition or renovation of the building to accommodate a new use.

The Commission discussed several possible uses for the Stone House which they believed would fit in well with the nature of the proposed history park. Ideas included an antique store and a tea room. Commissioner Ford stated a real estate official should take a look at the piece of property to try and determine the best use during the current economic environment. It was also brought up that the Village is in the process of creating a task force to determine the best use for the property.

## **B. Central Business District Discussion**

General discussion took place regarding the proposed new downtown group. Trustee Liaison Ladesic answered questions on how the new group will work with other development focused groups in the Village.

Chairman Marks stated that the Central Business District may be an ideal place for a nationally registered historic district. Staff Liaison Letson mentioned that the Management Team is currently exploring this idea.

## **7. Trustee Report**

Trustee Liaison Ladesic updated the Commission on the status of the Hill Avenue Bridge. He stated several discussions have taken place regarding this issue and the two communities have almost reached an agreement. He also updated the Commission on the current issues with the College of DuPage (COD) and their refusals to abide by the Glen Ellyn Village Code. He stated discussion will continue and he was confident the Village has authority to enforce the Village Code on the COD campus and will keep the Commission updated as new information becomes available.

## **8. Staff Liaison's Report**

Staff Liaison Letson noted that the upcoming public meeting to present the results of the

2009-2010 Architectural Resources Survey will be advertised in the Village's quarterly newsletter. In addition, he reported that Glenbard West plans to do the necessary work to prepare for installation of lights at Memorial Field, but they will require a variation to actually install them.

With no further business, Chairman Marks asked for a motion to conclude the meeting. Commissioner Ford motioned for adjournment. Commissioner Loftus seconded. The motion passed unanimously and the meeting was adjourned at 8:32 p.m.
