

COMMUNITY ENHANCEMENT FUND

This Fund was established to account for an anonymous \$2,000,000 citizen donation received by the Village in November, 2001.

This donation was acknowledged by the Village Board through Resolution No. 01-31 in December, 2001 and the proceeds allocated toward the following community improvements, in keeping with the donor's preferences for the use of these funds:

1. Improve the water quality of Lake Ellyn.
2. Bury overhead utility wires.
3. Visually enhance primary entryways into the Village.

BUDGET FOOTNOTES

- 1 **Entryway Improvements: (\$470,000)** - Amount shown for FY06 will complete various streetscape improvements at the Five Corners northern entryway into the Village. The total cost of these improvements exceeds \$1 million with a portion of the project costs paid by the Capital Projects Fund and Water and Sanitary Sewer Fund.
- 2 **Lake Ellyn Water Quality Enhancements: (\$500,000)** - Amount shown for FY06 is the estimated cost of a designed low-flow bypass pipe through Lake Ellyn which is to improve the overall lake water quality as well as make conditions more favorable to the formation of ice during the winter months.
- 3 **Utility Undergrounding: (\$250,000)** - Amounts allocated from Community Enhancement Fund dollars for utility undergrounding will take place at Five Corners, on Pennsylvania from Glenwood to Western, at Glen Oak Park and Presidents Park.
