Downtown Planning Study to Assess New Opportunities

The Village is undertaking a comprehensive review of the downtown business district in order to begin long-range planning and to identify potential opportunities. The downtown development study will complement the Village Comprehensive Plan that was updated in April 2001.

One of the first steps will be to seek a qualified team of consultants this fall to lead the study. As the planning process progresses, the Village will be soliciting feedback through surveys and at community workshops. Residents will be able to access additional details through updates on Glen Ellyn's website, www.glenellyn.org, and through the *Village Newsletter*.

The overall goal of the study is to develop a vision for preserving, maintaining and improving Glen Ellyn's historic downtown.

It is anticipated that the final plan will review the following downtown issues:

- Analysis of existing conditions (e.g. assessed values, building conditions, zoning, land uses, historic assets, patterns of ownership)
- Assessment of existing strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and obstacles
- Market analysis
- Review of parking conditions
- Identification of opportunities to support reinvestment/redevelopment



- Preparation of a long range plan
- Development of strategies for executing the plan, which may include:
 - Priority improvement projects
 - Existing building maintenance suggestions
 - Capital improvement and streetscape projects by the Village
 - Identification of potential funding sources/options
 - Suggested organizational structure for ongoing downtown marketing efforts



Clearwater Program for Illegal Sump Pump Connections

Last Chance to Participate in Cost-Sharing Program Ending Sept. 30

The Village's Clearwater Removal Program is designed to reduce the amount of clearwater entering the sanitary sewer system and cut down on instances of sewage backing up into basements.

The Clearwater Program primarily affects homeowners whose sump pumps discharge water into the sanitary sewer system. These connections are illegal and must be corrected under the program. For example, a typical 8-inch sanitary sewer main can handle wastewater from approximately 460 homes, but will be overloaded if only 12 of those homes have sump pumps operating at full capacity and discharging into the sanitary sewer. The result: sewage backups in basements. To reduce these problems,

the Village has initiated an inspection program. Under the program, any illegal sump pump connection must be corrected before selling your home.

As a major incentive to have homes inspected, there will be no charge prior to September 30, 2007. After September 30, 2007, a \$50 inspection fee will be required. If a voluntary inspection of your plumbing system is made before September 30, 2007, and an illegal sump pump-sanitary sewer connection is found, the Village will share in the cost of repairs up to \$2,500.

If you think you have a sump pump that discharges into the sanitary sewer system,

you should call Public Works at (630) 469-6756 as soon as possible to set up an inspection of the home plumbing system in order to take advantage of the cost-sharing program. If an illegal connection is found, these corrections will have to be made before you sell your home or you will not be issued a Real Estate Transfer Tax Stamp by the Village, required at closing.

GE Police Warn Residents to Lock Cars in Driveways

During the summer months, the number of reported burglaries to motor vehicles increased. The Glen Ellyn Police Department would like to remind residents to take precautionary measures to protect their belongings. The majority of these reports involve offenders entering vehicles that have been left unlocked. Oftentimes, belongings are left on the front seat or in plain view for an offender to see. Please remember:

- Keep your vehicle locked with the windows closed.
- Remove purses, cameras, I-pods and other valuable items from your vehicle when it is unattended.
- Keep your garage door closed and locked.
- When not at home, park in well lit areas.

Be alert for any suspicious activity and report it immediately by calling 911.

Fire Company Fund Drive and Open House

The Volunteer Fire Company's annual fund drive will begin in October. This fundraising event is conducted entirely by mail and no resident will be contacted by phone. Please do not contribute to organizations that solicit by phone.



To help kick off this annual appeal, the Glen Ellyn Volunteer Fire Company will be holding an Open House on Saturday, October 13, from 10 a.m. - 1 p.m., and Monday, October 15, from 7 p.m. - 9:30 p.m., as part of Fire Prevention Week. Saturday's event will be held solely at the downtown fire station located at Main St. and Pennsylvania Ave., while the Monday evening event will be held at both fire stations: the downtown fire station and the south side fire station at 681 Taft Ave. Firefighting equipment will be on display and fire safety educational material will be available.

Residents are asked to make a tax-deductible contribution of \$95 per household and businesses are asked to contribute \$190. Residents can receive a fire mark for their home for a \$145 donation, while businesses can receive a fire mark for \$240.

On Sunday, October 21, from 1:30 - 4:00 p.m., the Glen Ellyn Volunteer Fire Company will be featured at the Glen Ellyn Historical Society's Third Sunday Event at Stacy's Tavern Museum, 557 Geneva Rd., Glen Ellyn. As a tribute to the Glen Ellyn Volunteer Fire Company and their 100th Anniversary in 2007, the Historical Society will re-enact the old-time bucket brigade—used in the 1800s to douse fires that sprang up in the pioneer settlements. Visitors can participate and docents will be on hand to direct the operation. 
While the Tavern Day event is free, tickets to the three medicine shows are \$5 for adults and \$2.50 for children ten years old and younger. Tickets can be purchased at The Book Store, McChesney Miller Grocery Store and Stacy's Tavern Museum. Tickets go on sale August 30 with 50 tickets available for each show.



The Tavern Day celebration will also feature an Apple Festival Bake Sale offering home-baked apple pies, apple pan dowdy, apple crisp, and applesauce cake. Old time recipes will be used to produce apple pies, apple strudels, coffee cakes, muffins and breads.

Another unique attraction will be Uncle Jake, a wandering teller of tales, fables and other unaccountable experiences. He will charm audiences with his stories throughout the afternoon.

Halloween Fun, Downtown Glen Ellyn, October 27



There's something for everyone at the Glen Ellyn Chamber of Commerce's Halloween Festival in downtown Glen Ellyn on Saturday, October 27, 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.

- **Kids' Halloween Parade: 10 a.m.** The annual Kids' Parade steps off at 10 a.m. at Prairie Path Park (south of the train station between Park Blvd. and Forest Ave.). Kids should arrive no later than 9:45 a.m. The parade will march east through Prairie Path Park, south on Park, west on Duane and north on Forest back to the start. Ribbon awards will be given to every participant and children do not need to register for the parade this year. Please note: Hand-pulled strollers and wagons are the only vehicles allowed in the parade.
- **Downtown Trick-or-Treating: 10 a.m. - 2 p.m.** Kids in costume can trick-or-treat in the downtown area on Saturday, October 27. Children must be accompanied by an adult and are welcome in stores and businesses bearing a "Trick-or-Treat Here" sign. There will also be children's crafts, face painting and a variety of street performers.
- **Family Pumpkin Decorating Contest** Decorate a pumpkin and bring it to the Glen Ellyn Civic Center between 8 and 9 a.m. and reclaim it after 2 p.m. Pumpkins will be exhibited on the tiered walls leading to the Civic Center main entrance and will be judged for: spookiest, funniest, most unique, hometown pride and best character likeness.

Halloween Safety

- Wear light-colored clothing that's short enough to prevent tripping and add reflective tape to the sides, front and back of costume.
- Make sure children can see well through face masks or use cosmetics to create masks.
- Adults should accompany young children.
- Go out in daylight and carry a flashlight in case of delay.
- Stay within your neighborhood and only visit homes you know.
- Only give and accept wrapped or packaged candy.
- Examine all candy before allowing children to eat it.
- Avoid hard plastic or wood props such as daggers or swords. Substitute with foam rubber.

The Village of Glen Ellyn places great value in its community forest. For its efforts, the Village has been named Tree City USA by the National Arbor Day Foundation for 23 consecutive years. This honor reflects the commitment that the Village and its residents have made to preserve the community's extraordinary collection of trees. The community forest within Glen Ellyn contributes to the Village's unique character and quality of life and is one of the physical features that draw people to live and visit here. Two invasive insects, however, threaten the health of the Village's trees. The Emerald Ash Borer has killed millions of trees in neighboring states. Gypsy Moths, as well, can defoliate a tree in a matter of days. Both of these insects have been spotted in or near Glen Ellyn. Use the following information to help prevent the spread of these invasive insects within our community.

Ash Borer Close to Glen Ellyn

The Emerald Ash Borer is an invasive insect that has killed 20 million trees in Michigan. It was recently discovered in Glendale Heights, just north of Glen Ellyn.

The Village of Glen Ellyn has 1,952 parkway ash trees — approximately 13 percent of our total parkway tree population. Using formulas developed by the Council of Tree & Landscape Appraisers, the value of these ash trees is estimated to be \$7.1 million.

The estimated removal and replacement cost is approximately \$850,000. The Village is in the process of developing a response plan for the Emerald Ash Borer.

Additionally, the Village is in a quarantine zone, which means that no ash wood can be moved out of this zone or a fine will be levied by the Illinois Department of Agriculture.

How you can help:

- This insect is spread through the movement of infected firewood. Please do not move firewood outside of the quarantine zone and only purchase it from a local source.
- Go to: www.Illinoiseab.com to obtain more information and to view the pictures of what an infected tree looks like. If you think you may have an infected ash tree, contact an arborist immediately to have the tree inspected, in addition to notifying Public Works at (630) 469-6756.
- All tree care companies and landscapers should file a compliance agreement with the Department of Agriculture, which means they understand the consequences of this insect and agree with the regulations set forth. If you hire a company, ask if they have signed this agreement.

Gypsy Moths also Threat to Trees in Glen Ellyn

Residents are reminded that Gypsy Moth infestations were found in Glen Ellyn last summer. Gypsy moths can defoliate a tree in a matter of days, leading to stress and susceptibility to deadly diseases.

Residents should watch for Gypsy Moths and/or their eggs in their trees and on their property — especially in sheltered areas, such as under decks and lawn furniture. Gypsy Moth eggs are covered with a dense mass of tan or buff-colored hairs that are approximately 1-1/2" long x 3/4" wide. Gypsy Moth caterpillars are easy to identify because they have dark-colored hairs and five pairs of blue dots followed by six pairs of red dots lining their back. Older caterpillars are approximately 1-1/2 to 2" long.

Adult Gypsy Moths emerge from the pupa in 10-14 days and are present from July through August. Females have white to cream-colored wings, a tan body, a 2" wingspan and cannot fly. Males are smaller with a 1-1/2" wingspan and are dark brown with feathery antennae. Both the male and female have an inverted V-shape that points to a dot on the wing. If you suspect a Gypsy Moth infestation on your property, it is strongly recommended that you contact a private tree contractor. If you see signs of Gypsy Moths on a parkway tree, please contact Public Works as soon as possible at (630) 469-6756.



Parkway Reforestation Program

The goal of the Village's Reforestation Program is to plant trees in open parkway spaces throughout the community. Planting occurs two times per year: in the spring and fall. Planting for the Village's Fall Reforestation Program is scheduled for October. Open parkway spots have already been identified for the October planting and trees have been selected. If you are interested in having a tree planted in the spring of 2008, however, please call Public Works for an inspection. 
Construction Update

The following construction work is currently underway within Glen Ellyn.

- The Lambert Farms Utility Improvements Project is substantially complete. Roadway edge and shoulder repairs will be performed once sod watering is complete. Any required sod replacements will be performed in the fall.
- The Duane Street Improvements Project is well into its second month of construction. Underground work is complete between Forest and Park. Storm sewer installations throughout the entire project corridor are nearly complete and street-building activities will be underway in early September. All new curbs and driveways will be installed in the corridor along with full-depth asphalt roadway.
- Construction work on the East Panfish Basin Improvements Project began in late July. Water mains on Nicoll and Wilson have been installed and have passed their tests. New storm sewer will be completed in September on Nicoll and Pershing, in addition to the other remaining underground improvements in the project area. Street resurfacing, sidewalks and landscaping will be performed in September.
- Underground improvements on Exmoor Ave. and DuPage Blvd. (in the area of Newton Park) are substantially complete and street reconstruction on Exmoor has just begun.
- Underground work in the area of Lakeview Terrace, Crest and Forest began in August and will take about two months to complete.
- Street resurfacing in the area of Main, Wilson and Harding is also expected to take place soon – most likely in concert with other paving work.

2007 ARC Trophy and Vivan Ball Award

Each year, the Architectural Review Commission (ARC) evaluates new development projects and renovations to commercial and multi-



family buildings completed in the previous calendar year for the Traveling Trophy Award. The purpose of this award is to acknowledge excellence in building design. The winner is selected based on how the improvements to the building and site serve to promote a coherent and unique community identity.

The ARC also presents a Vivian Ball Landscape Award each year. Established in 2000, this award was instituted in memory of Vivan Ball who was active in Village beautification and recognizes excellence in achieving the aesthetic landscape objectives of the Village.

Donate Old Cell Phones to Support Family Shelter Service

The Glen Ellyn Civic Center is a collection point for old cell phones. This collection supports the work of Family Shelter Service, an organization that helps victims of domestic violence. Donated cell phones are processed through an environmentally friendly refining program that reclaims precious metals and returns the proceeds – up to \$30 per phone – to Family Shelter.

Volunteer Spotlight: Rod Pennington



For Rod Pennington, you could say that volunteering for Glen Ellyn's Fire Company is "a family affair." Rod has served nearly 31 years with the Company and his

brother, Ed, 17 years. Rod's son, Brian, is enrolled in the Fire Science curriculum at College of DuPage and plans to join the Fire Company when he's 21.

This legacy of multiple family members joining Glen Ellyn's Fire Company is one of the reasons the volunteer force is celebrating 100 years of service to the community this year.

"We inherited volunteerism from my Dad," Rod said. "As kids we were taught to be good stewards of our God-given

talents and to use those talents to make the world a better place."

For Rod, the opportunity to do that came when he made a sales call on Stuart S. Stone, former publisher of the *Glen Ellyn News* and Glen Ellyn's Fire Chief from 1978 to 2001.

"He asked me at the end of the sales call if I would like to join the Fire Company," Rod said, "and I agreed."

And as the operator of a downtown business, Rod has been a major asset to the Company. He owns Express Press Printing in downtown Glen Ellyn which enables him to respond quickly to fire calls during the day. Rod recalls a time when many of the firefighters were employed in the downtown, as well.

"Twenty years ago, there were always 10 to 15 firemen who also worked downtown and could respond to daytime emergency calls." Since that is no longer true, the Fire Company today employs a three-member day engine staff, first instituted in 2001.

Over the years, Rod has found great satisfaction in his work for the Fire Company. "When you donate your talents for the good of the community," he said, "you also receive something back. It's very fulfilling to help people in need. And in turn, you meet a lot of nice people who will give you the shirt off their back in your time of need."

Rod is a 50-year resident of Glen Ellyn and he and his wife, Joyce, have three children: Amanda and Valerie who are both teachers, and Brian, who is a student at College of DuPage.

In addition to his duties at Express Press, Rod is also a part-time realtor. "People often say they don't have the time to volunteer," he said, "but you have to make the time. It's worth the investment and you're never bored." ■

Senior Services in Glen Ellyn

The Glen Ellyn Senior Center, located at Grace Lutheran Church, 493 Forest Avenue, Glen Ellyn, provides a variety of services to seniors in Glen Ellyn and is a registration site for Senior RTA Reduced Fare Permits and the Ride DuPage Program.

Ride DuPage is a subsidized transportation program for residents of the Village of Glen Ellyn. Transportation is provided by a combination of taxicabs and small Pace buses. The fare is \$1.00 to start and an additional \$1.00 per mile. Service is available anywhere within DuPage County, 24 hrs/day, 7 days/week. Applicants must be at least 60 years of age, or have a documented disability and reside in the Village of Glen Ellyn. There are no income requirements for this program.

In addition, the Glen Ellyn Senior Center is a Senior Health Insurance Program (SHIP) site. Assistance is available for help with Medicare and other insurance questions. The Senior Center also hosts monthly bingo, bridge and bunco groups; provides a free monthly senior newsletter; free monthly blood pressure screenings; various activities and programs each month; and information and referral services for issues involving senior citizens.

The Glen Ellyn Senior Center will hold its annual flu shot clinic on Monday, October 29, from 9:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m. Appointments for flu shots can be made after October 1, 2007. RAPID REMINDERS

▶ **It is a violation of Village ordinance to rake leaves into the street.** Leaves clog storm sewers and create dangerous driving conditions. Village street sweeping is also hindered when the streets are filled with leaves.

The best methods of leaf disposal are composting or mulching. You can also place the leaves in paper yard waste bags or reusable containers with Village yard waste stickers affixed. Yard waste – including leaves – is collected on the regular Monday garbage day. Yard waste stickers can be purchased from the Village Cashier's Office or from several area stores. Go to www.glenellyn.org and look under the "A-Z Index" for additional refuse information.

▶ **October will be the last month for the monthly tree branch and brush collection.** October pick-ups will take place:

—For both sides of Hill Ave. and north of Hill Ave., the second Monday of October, October 8.

—For south of Hill Ave., the third Monday of October, October 15.

▶ **Weekly yard waste collection**, with Allied Waste stickers affixed, will run through the end of November. Weekly yard waste pick-up, with stickers, will resume in April 2008.

New Area Code Approved for the Illinois 630 Area

Due to increased demand for telephone numbers, the Illinois Commerce Commission recently approved the addition of a new area code, 331, for the same geographic area as the 630 area code. Beginning on October 7, 2007, residents within the 630 area code will have to dial 1 + 630 + the seven-digit telephone number. The price of a call and coverage area will not change, however. Local calls will remain local regardless of the number of digits dialed. In addition to changing your dialing procedure, certain services and features will have to be reprogrammed, such as: call forwarding and speed dialing, voicemail services, life safety systems, fax machines, internet dial-up numbers, alarm and security systems and the like.
