## 2007 Street/Drainage Program Major Storm Sewer Improvements Completed this Year

In November 2000, Glen Ellyn voters approved an \$18 million bond issue for long-term street and storm sewer improvements within the Village. In addition to 17 major storm sewer projects, the 20-year program consists of complete reconstruction of approximately 10 miles of roadways and resurfacing of approximately 60 miles of Village streets featuring (where appropriate) full curb and gutter replacement and driveway approach replacement.

The program establishes a repair cycle not exceeding 20 years for asphalt roadways with the goal of achieving and maintaining a Pavement Condition Index (PCI) rating of "good" or "better" for all of the Village's streets.


The 2007 program should see the completion of the last of the major storm sewer improvements — including the East Panfish Basin and Kenilworth Basin projects — and significant roadway rehabilitation efforts including Duane Street. ## April 17 is Election Day

Through April 12, early voting is available for this election at the Glen Ellyn Civic Center: Mon. - Fri. from 8:30 a.m. - 4 p.m. (with extended hours on Thursday until 7 p.m.) and Sat. 9 a.m. - 12 noon.

## Program for Illegal Sump Pump Connections

The Village's Clearwater Removal Program has been instituted to reduce the amount of clearwater entering the sanitary sewer system and cut down on sewage back-ups into basements. Under the new program, any illegal sump connection must be corrected before selling your home. If you have the problem corrected between now and Sept. 30, 2007, however, the Village will share in the cost of the repairs up to \$2500. After that time, it will be the homeowner's financial responsibility.

If you are selling your home, you should call Public Works at 469-6756 up to three months before the date of title transfer to set up an inspection of the home plumbing system. The purpose of the inspection is to determine if an illegal sump pump connection exists. If an illegal connection is found, corrections must be made before the Village will issue a Real Estate Transfer Tax Stamp.

## Vehicle Stickers and Dog Licenses Must be Renewed by April 30

Vehicle stickers are now available for purchase at the Civic Center. If you have expired stickers or your vehicle stickers expire on April 30, 2007, you must purchase and display a new sticker on your car by midnight, April 30th. If you purchased a multi-year sticker, your renewal application will reference which vehicles do not require a new sticker by noting "Paid through ..." for the appropriate cars. All vehicles registered to a Glen Ellyn address, including leased vehicles, company cars, and vehicles kept outside of the Village, such as for college students, are required to purchase and display a current Glen Ellyn vehicle sticker.

There are several ways to purchase your vehicle stickers. It is recommended that you use the pre-printed renewal form, which was mailed to all Village residences mid-March, and return it using the pre-addressed envelope. If you need a new form or have not received your application, you may obtain a form on-line at [www.glenellyn.org](http://www.glenellyn.org) or during normal business hours at the Cashier's Office located on the first floor of the Civic Center. Once you've completed your application, you may drop off your application in the Village's collection box, located in front of the Civic Center, or purchase your stickers in person at the Cashier's Office. The Cashier's Office is open

for window transactions Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., with extended hours on Thursday evenings until 7 p.m. The Cashier's Office will also be open Saturday, April 28, from 9 a.m.-12 p.m. and Monday, April 30, until 7 p.m. The Police Desk sells stickers after normal business hours.


The due date to purchase a current sticker is Monday, April 30, 2007. Please note that a new sticker will not be issued unless all prior year stickers have been purchased. Beginning May 1, late fees of \$5 per month up to a maximum of \$30 will be assessed for each vehicle that has expired registration. Failure to display a current sticker incurs a fine of \$50.

Save yourself time & money!!! Purchase a three-year sticker at a discounted rate. Renew only once until 2010.

In addition, 2007 dog licenses must be purchased by April 30. Applications are included with the vehicle sticker renewal form sent to all households.



### **Backyard Wildlife Program**

Participants receive a quarterly newsletter and can work towards having their property certified as a Wildlife Sanctuary. The Glen Ellyn Backyard Wildlife Program is sponsored by the Village Links of Glen Ellyn. The Village Links was the first public golf course in the world to be fully certified as a wildlife sanctuary by Audubon International.

## Volunteer Spotlight: Jean Brizzolara



"You can't move into Glen Ellyn and not get swept up in the Fourth of July celebration," said Jean Brizzolara, the volunteer chairperson for the Fourth of July Committee. This committee is

responsible for putting on the community's Independence Day activities each year. "I tap into fond childhood memories that make Fourth of July in Glen Ellyn a really special day."

Brizzolara and her husband Steve Wilson moved to Glen Ellyn 24 years ago. "I'm a sucker for a parade," Brizzolara said, "and when I found the Fourth of July parade that first year I moved here, I thought 'Oh my gosh, this is wonderful.'"

Brizzolara later became a "Boomer Booster," a term given to those people who contribute money to help underwrite the cost of the festivities each year. Then Brizzolara discovered what many committee members know: "I

noticed that the people involved were having a blast," she said, "so I volunteered to work the food tent at the Picnic in the Park during the Cardboard Boat Regatta. They only asked for a two-hour commitment, but when the two hours were over, I didn't want to leave."

"I realized that I should get onto the Fourth of July Committee," Brizzolara continued, "and finally got up the courage to go up to Jim Rasins [committee treasurer] at the end of the Fourth of July Fireworks show and tell him that I wanted to do more the next year. He told me to call Linda Miller, the Chairman of the Committee."

While joining a new group can be daunting for some, Brizzolara said that she was immediately embraced by the committee. "It can be very intimidating to feel as if you must pass muster — to feel like an outsider — but not these guys. By the time I left that first night, I was an insider. There's something really great about the type of person this committee attracts."

Although she works long hours in her job at Allstate Insurance where she manages a team of technical professionals, Brizzolara finds that her committee involvement is energizing. "I don't feel over-committed being on the Fourth of July Committee," she said. "When you're with such a fun, engaged group of people, the time just disappears."

For the 2007 celebration, Brizzolara says that the committee is actively seeking volunteers, to contribute a couple hours or a day during the Fourth of July events, or to serve as a member of the committee which meets monthly from January to April and weekly in May and June.

"Even though it's a ton of work," Brizzolara said, "the people who are running the show are having the most fun of all. This is the one event where I feel like I'm connecting with Glen Ellyn. It reminds me why I love this town so much."

## 2006 Historic Preservation Commission Award Nominations

The historic character of our neighborhoods is an important feature of Glen Ellyn. To recognize restorations and new construction that contribute to the preservation of our historic streetscapes, the Village's Historic Preservation Commission annually recognizes outstanding projects. The deadline for submissions is April 30, 2007, for any project completed during the 2006 calendar year.

### Restoration of the Year Award

The Restoration of the Year Award recognizes an outstanding effort to restore a home's exterior in a manner contributing to the preservation of Glen Ellyn history. Entries are judged on how the exterior restoration is in keeping with the home's historic character.



### Streetscape Compatibility Award

The Streetscape Compatibility Award recognizes outstanding new homes in an architectural style and scale that contribute to the preservation of Glen Ellyn's historic streetscapes. Entries are judged on their compatibility with the existing streetscape.

### Architectural Details Award

The Architectural Details Award is presented for an outstanding effort to restore an exterior detail element of a home in a manner fitting its historic character. Examples of exterior detail elements would include porches, cornice work, leaded glass windows or decorative fencing.

# 2007 Street Rehabilitation Program

The following roadway and storm sewer improvements will take place during the 2007 construction season. For more information, call Glen Ellyn Public Works at 469-6756.

## Key to Roadway Improvement Terminology

**STREET RECONSTRUCTION** - Complete rebuilding of the roadway with either concrete or asphalt.

**TYPE IA RESURFACING** - Spot curb repairs; removal and replacement of asphalt surface.

**TYPE IB RESURFACING** - More extensive spot curb repairs; removal and replacement of asphalt surface.

**TYPE IC RESURFACING** - Curb installation or replacement on one side only; base repair; replacement of asphalt surface; special drainage or construction considerations.

**TYPE II RESURFACING** - Enhanced roadway repair efforts featuring total curb and driveway approach replacement, a greater level of street foundation repair than Type I, and removal and replacement of the asphalt surface.

**TYPE IIA REHABILITATION** - Full curb replacement; most driveway approaches will be replaced; more extensive parkway restoration; removal and replacement of asphalt surface and a replacement of the base.

## Regulations Regarding Garage Sale, Real Estate and Political Campaign Signs



displayed on the days of the sale, up to three days.

Residents should be aware of the Village regulations concerning signage on their property. The three types of signs referenced below may only be displayed on private property (e.g. inside the sidewalk). No signs are permitted in the public parkway.

Garage sale signs to advertise a private yard or garage sale should not exceed more than four square feet. These signs must only be

Real estate signs advertising property for sale or lease should not be more than five feet in height and must be removed within seven days after the sale, rental or lease has been accomplished. No more than one sign is permitted per lot, except corner lots where one sign per street front is permissible.

Political campaign signs announcing political issues or candidates seeking office should not exceed 32 square feet in size. The total of all signs on a private residential property may not exceed 32 square feet.



# RAPID REMINDERS

- **9-1-1 is not just for emergencies.**  
Remember to call 9-1-1 whenever you need to see a police officer.
- **Building and excavation permits** — designed to protect your family and property — are required for many building projects, including fences, driveways, decks, accessory structures, interior remodeling, heating and air-conditioning equipment, sewer and water service repair, electrical and plumbing work, swimming pools and lawn sprinkler systems, to name a few. For more information, contact the Building & Zoning Division at 547-5250, 8 a.m.- 4:30 p.m. If you are unsure of your project requirements, a staff member is available to answer your construction and zoning questions.
- **Missed your refuse pickup?**  
Residents who miss the refuse pickup on Monday, the regular collection day, should contact Allied Waste at 469-1036 before 12 noon on Tuesday to ensure that they will return on Tuesday for the missed pickup. If you do not call prior

to noon, Allied Waste will not return until the following week.

## ➤ **Billing Cycle Changes to the Monthly Water/Refuse Bill**

The Village is in the process of changing the distribution date for the monthly Water/Refuse bill sent to residents. Formerly, half of these invoices were mailed on the first of each month, with the balance mailed on the fifteenth of the month. To enhance efficiency and processing, all monthly Village services bills will be mailed on the first of each month. As a result, all bills will be due on the 20th of each month. For Auto-Pay customers, your account will be debited on the 20th of the month. For those residents whose bill date will be changing, the first invoice will reflect 45 days of refuse service during this one-time transitional period. Water and sewer consumption, however, will be billed for the typical 30-day cycle. For more information, call 547-5235.
