

## Flooding Can Occur Anywhere

Even homes that are miles from a body of water can fall victim to flooding from unforeseeable events such as heavy rainstorms or a broken sewer line. Ditches clogged with debris can contribute to flooding as well and should be monitored and periodically cleared to improve run-off capacity.

The following are some steps you can take to be prepared in the event of a flood.

- ✓ Copy your most important documents.
- ✓ Take photos of your most valuable personal possessions.
- ✓ Save and store receipts for any expensive household items.

### Have an Emergency Plan

- ✓ Give your emergency contact information to your insurance agent, employer and family members.

- ✓ Compile an emergency kit made up of a large flashlight, battery-powered radio, spare batteries, candles and waterproof matches.
- ✓ Keep a minimum three-day supply of nonperishable food and bottled water on hand.

### Flood Safety

- ✓ Do not drive through a flooded area. More people drown in cars than anywhere else.
- ✓ Do not walk through flowing water — currents can be deceptive.
- ✓ Be alert to gas leaks. Turn off the gas to your house before it floods. If you smell gas, report it to your gas company and the Fire Company at 911. If you smell gas or are unsure if your gas has been shut

off, do not use candles, lanterns or open flames.

- ✓ Keep children away from flood waters, ditches, culverts and storm drains. Floodwaters can carry all sorts of debris and culverts can set up deadly suction currents.

*Keeping smaller ditches and streams free of debris can dramatically improve run-off capacity.*

- ✓ Clean everything that has been wet. Sewage and other chemicals in floodwaters can pose severe health threats.
- ✓ Watch for animals, especially snakes.
- ✓ Do not use gas engines, such as generators, or charcoal fires indoors during power outages. Carbon monoxide exhaust can pose serious health hazards.

## Village Program for EAB-Infested Ash Trees



**The Emerald Ash Borer has caused the death of millions of ash trees in the Midwest.**

The Emerald Ash Borer (EAB) is an invasive beetle native to Asia that was first discovered in Michigan and has now been identified in numerous Midwestern states, including Illinois.

The adult EAB nibbles on ash foliage, but causes little damage. The larvae, however, feed on the inner bark of ash trees, interfering with the tree's ability to transport water and nutrients, and ultimately, causing its death.

Glen Ellyn has approximately 15,500 parkway trees of which about 1,900 are ash trees (12 percent of the total parkway tree population).

In order to help stem the spread of EAB (first discovered in Glen Ellyn in 2009), the Village's Forestry Division has developed a management plan for this invasive pest. While the Village's plan for EAB is flexible — since new and better treatments are continually coming onto the market — the current plan calls for removal of EAB-infected trees and treatment of approximately 200 healthy specimens selected by the Village.

An inspection of all Village parkway ash trees has pinpointed those trees with signs of infestation. These trees exhibit some of the following symptoms: crown dieback, sprouting, bark splits, D-shaped holes, S-shaped larvae galleries, presence of larvae, woodpecker damage and presence of adult beetles (adults are only present May through August). Trees exhibiting two or more signs of infestation will be designated for removal.

Any parkway ash tree not included in the removal or treatment program will be categorized as a "no action" tree. Residents may choose to fund a chemical treatment of the parkway tree to help prolong its life. Residents interested in treating their parkway tree must contact the Public Works Department at 630-469-6756 as soon as possible.

Chemical treatment of ash trees for EAB must be performed every one to two years, depending on the chemical, for the life of the tree. The approximate cost of treatment is \$34 per tree per year.

If you think you may have an infested ash tree on the parkway, contact the Village Forester immediately at 630-469-6756. If you suspect an infestation on your own private property, please contact an arborist as soon as possible. If the arborist confirms the presence of EAB, please report it immediately to the Village Forester. Also, if you suspect an infestation on private property that is not your own, please contact the Village Forester.

Private property trees that exhibit signs of EAB infestation must be removed within 30 days of notification. Any landscape or tree care company performing work in the Village must sign a compliance agreement prior to doing any work.

## Vehicle Sticker Deadline

*was April 30, 2010*

The deadline for purchasing and displaying vehicle stickers was April 30. If you have not purchased your vehicle stickers, a late fee of \$5.00 per sticker will be added each month for up to six months. Your vehicle may also be ticketed at an added cost of \$50. Vehicle stickers can be purchased at the Cashier's Office in the Civic Center from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. weekdays. Vehicle stickers can also be purchased at the Police Department 24 hours a day. Remember, when you sell your house, the Village will collect all unpaid Village fees and corresponding late penalties before issuing real estate transfer stamps, necessary for closing on a sale.

**REMINDER:** Residents can purchase a three-year vehicle sticker, expiring on April 30, 2013, at a discounted price of \$70. Reduce the time you spend completing and mailing annual renewal applications and save yourself a few bucks!

## The Block Party Wagon



The block party wagon makes block parties more fun. Through an intergovernmental agreement, the Village and Park District offer two covered block party wagons which each hold 10 tables, 100 chairs, a tent and other party accessories — everything you need for your block party.

During your block party, you can also invite a GE police officer and find out what it's like to sit in the front seat of a computerized, state-of-the-art police vehicle.

## Volunteer Profile: Ro Manak

**F**or Glen Ellyn's Fourth of July volunteers, the spring and summer can be a whirlwind of activity in order to plan and put on the annual event. But all of these volunteers are consistent in one thing: they love the work they do on the committee.

"For a very small amount of time and effort on your part," said Fourth of July Committee volunteer Ro Manak, "you can be part of making wonderful memories for others and yourself."

Ro and her husband Tom Manak (the current Fourth of July Committee Chairman) first joined the committee 20 years ago, shortly after moving to Glen Ellyn. Ro, a native of Newport, RI, met Tom in college at Marquette University in Milwaukee, WI. When choosing a place to live, the newlywed couple decided that Chicago was "too big" and lived in Racine, WI; Fargo, ND; Eureka, CA; Los Angeles and Washington D.C.

When the Manaks finally settled in Glen Ellyn in 1987, Tom and Ro knew they had made a good choice. "We spent six months looking at suburbs throughout the Chicago area," Ro said. "My college roommate lived in Glen Ellyn and we just loved the hills and trees."

The Manaks soon came to have a deeper appreciation for the benefits of living in Glen Ellyn. "We know so many people here," she said, "even in many of the stores. It's very rare that we don't see someone we know when we are shopping or eating out in Glen Ellyn: our friends, someone we know through church or even our dentist."

Although Ro suffers from early onset Parkinson's Disease, similar to that which affects actor Michael J. Fox, she tries not to let it slow her down and continues to carry out a myriad of volunteer activities for the Fourth of July Committee. "Over the years I've done many different things for the committee," she said, "such as parade marshal, organizing banner carriers, recruiting volunteers, ordering

t-shirts, cashiering at the Picnic in the Park and selling glow-in-the-dark necklaces at the fireworks. I mostly do a lot of the small things that need to be done to make everything run a little more smoothly."

One of the committee's biggest challenges has always been finding the hundred some volunteers necessary to put on the Picnic in the Park (the companion event to the Cardboard Boat Regatta) and the massive Fourth of July Parade, as well as to help with pre-fireworks activities.

Ro is encouraged, however, that some new, younger volunteers have joined the committee this year. "We've got some new blood on the committee now," she said, "and they have good ideas. We're always looking for new people, though, and I encourage others to try it — even if just for a few hours."

### Garage Sale and Real Estate Signs



Residents are reminded that there are regulations concerning garage sale and real estate signs. These signs may only be displayed on private property (i.e. between the sidewalk and the residence). No signs are permitted in the public parkway. Signs in the parkway may be removed and discarded by Village personnel.

Garage sale signs should not exceed four square feet and should only be displayed on the day of the sale — up to three days.

Real estate signs advertising property for sale or lease should not be more than five feet in height and must be removed within seven days after the sale, rental or lease has been executed. No more than one sign is permitted per lot, except corner lots where one sign per street front is permissible.

## New Regulations for Contractors

### Registration Requirements

New Village regulations require that contractors performing work within the Village of Glen Ellyn must first register with the Village. These new regulations will help to improve consumer protection and prohibit contractors from working in the Village if they do not meet certain minimum requirements, such as liability and property damage insurance. The new registration requirements affect those building permit applications received after March 15, 2010. ### Lead-Based Paint Requirements

New regulations from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) require that contractors that work in any structure where they are disturbing lead-based paint (built before 1978), must now be certified to work with lead-based paint. The new requirements outline specific work practices and procedures that must be followed when disturbing lead-based paint and mandate that someone certified in these practices must remain on site during project construction. ### Top Ten Poisonous Plants

Many of the flowering plants we enjoy throughout spring and summer may be toxic to humans and/or pets. While some are only mildly toxic if ingested, others can cause more serious symptoms. Following are 10 toxic plants in common use.

- **Daffodils:** *bulbs are toxic*
- **Rhododendron:** *leaves are toxic and so is honey made from the flower nectar*
- **Ficus:** *milky sap in leaves and stems toxic*
- **Oleander:** *all plant parts toxic*
- **Chrysanthemum (mums):** *flower heads somewhat toxic; touching them can cause mild allergic reactions*
- **Flamingo Flowers or Pigtail Plants (Anthuriums):** *all plant parts mildly toxic*
- **Lily of the Valley:** *all plant parts toxic*
- **Hydrangea:** *blossoms are toxic*
- **Foxglove:** *all plant parts toxic*
- **Wisteria:** *all plant parts toxic*

### Watering Restrictions Begin May 15

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources mandates that water conservation measures be undertaken between May 15 and September 15.

During this time period, the Village of Glen Ellyn will be enforcing these lawn sprinkling regulations. The regulations allow odd-numbered street addresses to water lawns on odd-numbered calendar days, while even-numbered street addresses may water on days that have an even-numbered calendar date. Lawn sprinkling on this odd/even schedule may only be performed from 5 to 8 a.m. and 7 to 11 p.m.

- **To help maintain the peace and tranquility of our neighborhoods**, residents are asked to minimize the use of yard maintenance equipment, especially after 7 p.m. Please be aware, too, that the noise from yard maintenance equipment carries a long way anytime it is used.
- **Private lighting in residential neighborhoods can be disturbing to neighbors.** With the increased use of landscaping and security lights, be aware of whether your light is shining into your neighbors' homes, especially late at night.
- **If you experience a power outage**, please contact ComEd at 800-334-7661.
- **As students begin their summer vacations**, residents are reminded that the curfew for children under 17 years of age is 11 p.m., Sunday to Thursday, and midnight on Friday and Saturday. Parents are responsible for ensuring that their children meet these curfew regulations.
- As the growing season continues, **please keep grass and weeds cut to less than 8"**. Also, residents are asked to trim private property tree limbs and shrubs that overhang sidewalks or parkways so they do not pose safety hazards. If parkway trees need to be trimmed, please call the Public Works Department at 630-469-6756.
- **Storage units or "PODS" are in use throughout our community more and more.** Residents should be aware that these units may not be located on your property more than 30 days in any calendar year or more than 15 consecutive days at one time.
