Plan for Glen Ellyn's Downtown Advances



In 2009, the Village Board adopted a strategic plan for Glen Ellyn's central business district that had been crafted after several years of planning and research. Working with a consultant skilled in downtown planning, as well as an advisory committee of community members, the Village gathered citizen input at several public meetings before adopting the final plan.

The plan is designed to enhance and stimulate business investment in our central business district and the Village is now moving forward with a number of the plan's recommendations. The Village has:

- Created a new downtown organization responsible for marketing, events, business retention, communication and has an ombudsman role in the downtown.
- Has been awarded a grant for Streetscape and Parking Planning through the Chicago Metropolitan Agency for Planning.
- Conducted a feasibility study for a tax increment financing (TIF) district, which the Village is currently evaluating with the assistance of Ehlers & Associates of Lisle, IL.
- Hired a consultant to evaluate whether one-way streets should be made two-way, and if so, what the impact would be on parking and circulation.
- Streamlined the permit process for businesses to hold special events, provide live entertainment and offer other enticements to attract customers.
- Adopted a property maintenance code that enables the Village to enforce certain minimum maintenance requirements for properties in the Village to help maintain property values and the streetscape appearance of the commercial districts.
- Advanced the Village's plan to review and update zoning code standards.
- Adopted a new code requiring decorative displays in vacant storefront windows to enhance the appearance of the downtown and create a more vibrant streetscape.



Glen Ellyn Welcomes New Village Manager Mark Franz

On July 12, Mark Franz took over as Glen Ellyn's new Village Manager.



Franz brings a wealth of experience to the position, including nearly eight years as Village Manager for Homewood, IL. He also has held positions with the municipalities of Northbrook and Evanston, IL. He was one of 82 individuals under consideration for the position.

Franz, who with his wife Carla has five children, is a graduate of Indiana University, Bloomington, IN, and holds a Master's Degree from Northern Illinois University, Dekalb, IL.

Glen Ellyn's Village Manager is responsible for the daily operations of a staff that includes 105 full-time and 50 part-time employees. The Village welcomes Mark to his new position and thanks him for his commitment to the community.

Village Personnel Provide Speedy Response to Summer Storms

This summer's violent storms caused widespread devastation in Glen Ellyn, including downed trees and power lines. To ensure the safety of residents and provide ongoing updates, the Village staff and first responders worked long hours after the events.

The Glen Ellyn Police Department set up extra patrols in those neighborhoods without power, and, together with Public Works and the Civic Center, fielded hundreds of calls reporting downed power lines and tree limbs.

Public Works personnel worked overtime to cordon off dangerous areas where power lines and large branches posed a safety hazard to residents and removed limbs blocking roadways.

Village staff stayed in constant contact with ComEd to get updates on restoration of electric service, and also kept residents informed through media releases and Glen Ellyn radio station AM 1620.

The Village expresses its appreciation to the entire staff for their hard work and speedy response to these devastating storms. Their efforts are greatly appreciated.



Refuse/Yard Waste Stickers

Manor Woods Reopens

Glen Ellyn's Manor Woods Park, located at the intersection of Brandon Avenue and Illinois Street, recently reopened its trails after an extensive cleanup effort conducted to remove fallen trees, branches and debris that had accumulated along the paths.

This work, which was performed by Bedrock Earthscapes of Wheaton, IL, together with Public Works and Park District employees and community volunteers, greatly improves the safety and aesthetics of this area that is characterized by wet and spongy sections of peat. Wood-chipped trails were added in the 1990s to make this natural area more accessible to the public.

Stacy's Corners Has New Look

Glen Ellyn's History Park is located at Stacy's Corners in Glen Ellyn — the intersection of Geneva Road and Main Street — and is the site of the first settlers to Glen Ellyn in 1834. The History Park property, which includes Stacy's Tavern Museum, the Glen Ellyn History Center, Ward Plaza and Stacy's Corners Store, offers a wide variety of ways to enjoy Glen Ellyn's history. Photos below show the transformation of this northern gateway to the Village, which included the Village's purchase of the property on the southwest corner and the demolition of an old gas station on the southeast corner of the Geneva and Main Street intersection.

Village Links Master Plan Renovations Evaluated

In October 2010, the Village Links Steering Committee and staff began to outline the components of a new master plan for the golf course in order to expand the capabilities of this facility, wholly owned by the Village of Glen Ellyn and completely funded by Links profits and not tax dollars. The Village Board is currently evaluating the potential benefits of this plan, which would be carried out in two phases and resident comments are still welcome.

Phase 1 improvements would primarily affect those facilities that are not part of the existing golf course:

- Renovation of the existing clubhouse would be designed to accommodate added hospitality events for golfers and other groups.

- Aging water, electric and natural gas lines would be upgraded with increased capacities for an expanded clubhouse facility.
- Parking lot lighting improvements would facilitate evening business hours and additional facility functionality.
- New stormwater management projects would help to maintain a well-balanced environment for this part of the community, which is characterized by numerous floodplain areas.
- New restroom facilities to comply with ADA regulations.

- A small tee addition would be constructed on the west side of the driving range tee; a 10-15-space artificial tee would be built with a protective cover for use in inclement weather.

Phase 2 involves the replacement of a portion of the original clubhouse with a lighted driving range, new pro shop and storage space. Phase 2 will take place when funding is available.

Flood Protection Resources

The Village continues to work to reduce flood risks, but reminds residents that there are ways to help protect your home.

The Village has prepared a flood protection brochure, which can be downloaded at the Village website www.glenellyn.org by clicking on "Village Publications" and then "Residential Drainage Brochure." Brochures also are available by calling the Planning and Development Department at 630-547-5250. If you have experienced flooding, Planning and Development Department staff can meet with you to discuss flood protection options.

Another excellent resource is the *Homeowner's Guide to Retrofitting: Six Ways to Protect Your House From Flooding* (FEMA Publication 312), available at the Glen Ellyn Public Library, or at no cost from the Federal Emergency Management Agency by calling 800-480-2520, or visiting www.fema.gov/hazards/floods/lib312.shtm.

Stormwater Regulations

Many properties have drainage swales, ditches or storm sewers to carry stormwater away from structures. Over time, fences, hedge rows, annual mulching and regrading can block or divert stormwater. Always check with the Planning and Development Department before you build on, grade, excavate or place fill on your property, since it is illegal to change the flow of water across your property. A permit may be required to avoid causing problems for you or your neighbors.

Nearly 1,000 Residents Participate in Recycling Extravaganza

Glen Ellyn continues to have one of the highest recycling rates in DuPage County, and the annual Recycling Extravaganza, sponsored by the Village's Environmental Commission, exemplified that fact.

On April 30, nearly 1,000 residents dropped off a variety of recyclables, including:

- 45,390 lbs. of electronic equipment
- 30 tricycles and bicycles
- One dumpster of scrap metal
- One truck-full of household goods
- 303 American flags
- 100 non-household batteries
- 50 fire extinguishers
- 300 pairs of eyeglasses

Provide Critical Care and Emergency Rescue Information through Smart911

The DuPage Emergency Telephone Service Board (ETSB) recently launched Smart911 — a new system that enables you to enter safety information online that can be automatically displayed to operators in the event of an emergency.

Why Should I Use Smart911?

Smart911 can help protect you and your loved ones by storing your critical care and emergency rescue information during a calm moment, when you can take the time to ensure that the information entered is correct and accurate. This information can be key for first responders in communicating with

you, understanding any special needs and locating your home.

Supplied information can include children's photos, medical conditions, home addresses of mobile phone callers, disabilities or other rescue-related information.

Participants can register cellular and smart phones, as well as land lines. Smart911 then automatically delivers this information with any 9-1-1 call to the call taker's work station at participating Public Service Answering Points. **To register for this free service, please visit www.smart911.com.** The information provided remains completely confidential

and is only available to emergency responders during a 9-1-1 call.

The DuPage ETSB serves 16 independent 9-1-1 dispatch centers. These centers, which include DUCOMM, provide police and fire dispatch services for Glen Ellyn and handle over 900,000 9-1-1 calls for service each year. DuPage ETSB E911 serves a resident population of over 932,541 and has a service delivery area of over 333 square miles.

Halloween: Oct. 29 & 31

On Halloween, Monday, October 31, suggested Trick-or-Treating hours are 3 - 7 p.m. By following some simple precautions, Halloween can be a fun and safe time for all:

- Wear light-colored clothing that's short enough to prevent tripping, and add reflective tape to the sides, front and back of costume.
- Make sure children can see well through face masks or use cosmetics to create masks.
- Adults should accompany young children.
- Go out in daylight and carry a flashlight in case of delay.
- Stay within your neighborhood and only visit homes you know and are well-lit.
- Only give and accept wrapped or packaged candy.
- Examine all candy before allowing children to eat it.
- Avoid hard plastic or wood props, such as daggers or swords. Substitute with foam rubber.



2011 ARC Traveling Trophy Design Award and Vivian Ball Landscape Award

Each year, the Architectural Review Commission (ARC) evaluates and awards projects that reflect excellence in community appearance. The Traveling Trophy Award recognizes building design and the Vivian Ball Landscape Award recognizes outdoor beautification. The winners are selected based on how the improvements promote compatible and attractive enhancements to the community and conform to the Village's appearance guidelines.

The Traveling Trophy Award is given annually to a new development or renovation to a commercial building completed in the previous year. The winner is selected based on how the improvements and building serve to promote a cohesive design. The Village congratulates **Central DuPage Hospital** located at **885 Roosevelt Road** on receiving this award.



The Vivian Ball Landscape Award was established in 2000 in memory of Vivian Ball who was active in Village beautification. The 2011 Vivian Ball Landscape Award was not awarded this year, but an honorable mention was given for the landscape design by **Centrum Properties**, for the **Glen Ellyn Crossing Shopping Center**, located at **699-727 Roosevelt Road**, at the southwest corner of Nicoll Way and Roosevelt Road.



Rapid Reminders

- **Driver's License Emergency Contact Registration.** Residents of the State of Illinois can now add two emergency contacts to their driver's license data. In that way, if you are incapacitated in any way, the license can be scanned and the emergency contacts retrieved. Registration only takes a few minutes at www.cyberdriveillinois.com.
- **To help prevent localized flooding,** please be sure that storm drains in your neighborhood are clear of leaves or grass clippings and debris. Also, never rake leaves into the street. This can cause dangerous conditions for drivers.
- **Snowplow drivers are needed for clearing Village streets** in the winter months. To apply, please call the Public Works Department at 630-469-6756.
- **October will be the last month for the monthly branch and brush collection.** October pick-ups will take place:
 - For both sides of Hill Ave. and north of Hill Ave., the second Monday of October, October 10.
 - For south of Hill Ave., the third Monday of October, October 17.
- **Weekly yard waste collection, with yard waste stickers affixed, will run through the end of November.** Weekly yard waste pick-up, with stickers, will resume in April 2012.
- **The Glen Ellyn Police Department reminds residents to keep homes and vehicles locked.** Residents are reminded to keep vehicles locked even when they are in their own driveway. If you think someone has been in your vehicle, please call 9-1-1.
- **Checking smoke detector batteries** in spring and fall when the time changes is a great way to remember this practice that could save a life. Daylight savings time ends this year on Sunday, November 6.
- **Information regarding assistance to seniors** can be obtained by calling the Glen Ellyn Senior Service Center at 630-858-6343.
- **Children are back in school** so please remember to drive carefully and heed all school zone speed limits.
- **Your home may be eligible for landmarking.** Residents are encouraged to apply to have their home landmarked if it is largely unchanged and represents an architectural type or style distinguished by innovation, rarity, uniqueness or overall quality of design, detail, materials or craftsmanship.
