Interim Village Manager, Department Interim Directors Announced

Terry Burghard has been appointed by the Glen Ellyn Village Board as Interim Village Manager, replacing former Village Manager Steve Jones who resigned in December after two-and-a-half years as manager.

An experienced Village Manager, Terry brings a wide variety of experience to the job and has held positions in such communities as Homewood, Mt. Prospect and Plainfield. In other Village departments, Jeff Perrigo has taken over as Interim Public Works Director and Larry Noller as Interim Finance Director. Both are existing Village employees who will help to ensure a smooth transition.

To assist in conducting the search for a permanent manager, the Village Board has selected Voorhees & Associates, a public management recruitment firm.

As these changes are implemented, residents can expect the same high quality of Village services.

Responding to the February Blizzard

THE BLIZZARD THAT HIT THE CHICAGO AREA ON FEBRUARY 1 AND 2 arrived with the fury that the National Weather Service anticipated. Snow began falling in earnest at approximately 2 p.m. on Tuesday, making for a slow afternoon commute.

Overnight, Tuesday into Wednesday morning, February 2, the area saw

wind gusts regularly exceeding 50 mph, with heavy snow bursts dropping snow at a rate of 3 - 4" inches per hour. The



combination of high winds and heavy snowfall created whiteout conditions, high drifts and treacherous driving conditions. When the blizzard ended at approximately 8 a.m. on Wednesday, the Village awoke to snow

accumulations of 20 - 22" and snow drifts in excess of six feet in some areas.

Public Works crews worked twelve-hour shifts around the clock in order to battle the blizzard. The full fleet of 15 plows was out throughout the night to keep up with the storm. The Public Works facility was staffed overnight to address any internal issues that arose from the storm and to provide guidance to the public and other departments.

The efforts of Public Works were realized with some basic milestones:

- Within 24 hours of the end of the blizzard, the Village's main streets, Central Business District parking lots and other high-priority areas were functioning.
- Within 48 hours of the end of the blizzard, the Village's Central Business District was cleared of the majority of the snow, secondary streets were cleared and many of the culs-de-sac were functional.
- Within 72 hours of the end of the blizzard, the majority of the Village was fully restored with only minor areas needing attention.

In addition, Public Works and Police Department personnel cleared sidewalks near schools to ensure the safety of students and assisted motorists whose vehicles were stuck.

The Village was fortunate to have the dedicated efforts of these individuals during this severe snowstorm.

A General Election will be held on Tuesday, April 5, for Glen Ellyn Village Board, township, park district, library district and school district officials. The candidates for three Village Trustee positions are: Robert Friedberg, Peter Ladesic and Diane McGinley. Candidates for three Library Board positions are: Maryl Wesolowski, Sharon Weber, John Mulherin and Bob McClow.

The Glen Ellyn Civic Center will serve as an early voting location March 14 through March 31. Hours will be: Mon.-Wed. and Fri.: 8:30 a.m. - 4 p.m.; Thurs.: 8:30 a.m. - 7 p.m.; Sat.: 9 a.m. - 12 noon.

To vote in this election, you must have registered 28 days prior. You can download the registration application from the DuPage Election Commission website at www.dupageelections.com and mail it in. You can also register at the Civic Center, Mon.-Fri. 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Two forms of I.D. are required, including one that shows your current address. formulation of the plan was guided by a committee of volunteer members and representatives from various community organizations, downtown merchants and property owners. The planning process included a number of opportunities for public input, as well.

Final recommendations included a guide for implementing the plan, together with a variety

of funding sources that could be used to make this vision a reality. One recommended funding source was the designation of Glen Ellyn's Central Business District as a Tax Increment Financing (TIF) District.

Implementation of a TIF District could provide funds for public infrastructure improvements and government financial incentives to stimulate investment in the downtown.

To conduct a Phase I TIF District Feasibility Study for Glen Ellyn's downtown, the Village selected Ehlers & Associates of Lisle, IL, after careful evaluation of several firms. The Feasibility Study, completed in February, will be used to determine whether the downtown area satisfies the criteria for TIF designation.

The Village Board will review the results of the study at a Board workshop in March and determine whether to move forward with application for TIF status for the Central Business District.

Adopted in October 2009, Glen Ellyn's Downtown Strategic Plan was prepared to identify and guide development opportunities to improve the Village's downtown area. The

Renew Vehicle Stickers and Dog Licenses by Saturday, April 30

Vehicle sticker fees provide Village revenue and help to pay for the maintenance of Village roadways and other capital improvements. The 2011 vehicle stickers must be purchased and displayed by midnight, Saturday, April 30. All vehicles registered to a Glen Ellyn address, including students away from home, leased vehicles, company cars and vehicles kept outside of the Village, are required to purchase and display a current Glen Ellyn vehicle sticker.

There are several ways to purchase your vehicle stickers. You may use the pre-printed renewal form mailed to all Village residences in mid-March. If you need a new form or have not received your application, you may obtain a form at www.glenellyn.org or during normal business hours at the Cashier's Office located on the first floor of the Civic Center. Once you've completed your application, you may mail it or drop it off in the Village's collection box, located in back of the Civic Center, or purchase your stickers in person at the Cashier's Office.


The Cashier's Office is open Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. - 4:30 p.m. The Cashier's Office will also be open Thursday, April 21, until 7 p.m. and Saturday, April 30, from 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. The Police Desk also sells stickers after normal business hours.

A new sticker will not be issued unless all prior year stickers have been purchased. Beginning May 1, late fees of \$5 per month will be assessed for each vehicle that has an expired registration. Failure to display a current sticker may result in a fine of \$50.

Save yourself time and money! Purchase a three-year sticker at a discounted rate, so you don't have to renew again until 2014.

Dog licenses also must be purchased by April 30. Applications are included with the vehicle sticker renewal form sent to all households. For more information, please call the Cashier's Office at 630-547-5235.

On the first Saturday morning of each month, the Chief of Police plays host to interested residents who would like to interact with law enforcement personnel in a non-enforcement environment. Participants can discuss neighborhood issues, such as traffic or parking; seek information on various police programs; and learn about specific police duties and responsibilities, such as investigations, traffic accident reconstructions and evidence collections. New Warning System Alerts Pedestrians to Multiple Trains

Beginning in March, a new pedestrian grade crossing system will be activated at eight stations along the Union Pacific West Line, including Glen Ellyn. The new system, called the Another Train Warning System (ATWS), is part of a \$132 million project that aims to improve the flow of commuter and freight traffic on the heavily used line, as well as to allow trains to safely operate past a station when a commuter train is stopped there.

Metra and Union Pacific studied station improvement initiatives across the country and the West Line safety infrastructure is incorporating the best practices, creating the most comprehensive safety system of any commuter rail operation in the U.S.

The Another Train Warning System uses audible and visual alerts to warn pedestrians at crossings near the stations that a second train – in addition to the one that is stopped at the station – is approaching or present.

Improvements at the Glen Ellyn station will not only include the ATWS at Main

Street and Park Boulevard, but also new pedestrian paths to safely guide commuters away from the tracks to a gated crossing.



Other enhancements include an upgraded rail signal system that will improve train flow, new crossovers that will make it easier to route a train around congestion

or an emergency and the completion of a third set of tracks in two areas that are now bottlenecks.

Safety around trains and railroad operations is everyone's responsibility. Metra and Union Pacific strongly encourage passengers, pedestrians, motor vehicle operators and all members of the public to obey all railroad signals and follow safety guidelines.

How the Train Warning System Works

The new Another Train Warning System (ATWS) uses visible and audible alerts to warn pedestrians that another train is present or approaching the station.

If a train is present and another is approaching:

- A red "Danger" sign illuminates and flashes continuously
- A white "Another Train Coming" sign illuminates steadily
- An audible warning sounds continuously
- The system stays active as long as there is more than one train in the area of the station

Be Prepared For Heavy Storms

Most of Glen Ellyn's flooding and drainage problems occur during and after heavy storms. Storms can happen at any time, but especially in spring and summer. Floods can happen fast, so here are some suggestions to prepare:

- Keep storm sewer inlets and drainage ditches clear of debris, including leaves and grass clippings.
- Make sure your sump pump is working.
- Monitor potential flood hazards on an All Hazards NOAA Weather Radio, local radio, television or on the internet at www.noaawatch.gov/floods.php.
- Copy your most important papers (mortgage papers, deeds, passport, bank and credit card information). Keep the copies in your home and place the originals outside your home in a secure place like a safety deposit box.
- Go through your basement (if not your entire house) and take photos of your most valuable possessions (furniture, musical instruments and electronic equipment). Store these photos with your other papers.

Save and store receipts for any expensive household items, such as appliances and electronics, to have proof of their cost.

Floodplain Questions?

To obtain assistance in determining whether your property is in the floodplain, contact the Planning and Development Department at (630) 547-5250 or visit the Glen Ellyn Civic Center. Copies of the Flood Insurance Rate Maps are also available at the Glen Ellyn Public Library and online at www.fema.gov. Additionally, the Planning and Development Department may have elevation certificates on file for buildings constructed in the floodplain.

Flood Insurance Available for all Glen Ellyn Properties

Most homeowners' policies do not cover flood losses. Since Glen Ellyn

participates in the National Flood Insurance Program, however, you can protect your home and contents by purchasing a flood insurance policy. You should obtain coverage for structure *and* contents, since there can be more damage to the contents than the structure. Renters can also buy contents coverage even if the owner does not insure the structure. Don't wait for the next flood to buy insurance protection. There is a 30-day waiting period before the policy becomes effective.

To find out more about flood insurance, contact any licensed insurance agent or broker – the same person who sells your home and auto policies. All agencies charge the same premiums. You may be denied federal assistance after a disaster if you don't have flood insurance.

Favorable Response to Village's Expanded EMS Coverage

In June of 2009, the Village of Glen Ellyn contracted with Public Safety Services, Inc., to provide expanded paramedic services to the Village. The new contract increased EMS coverage from one 24-hour and one 12-hour ambulance to two 24-hour ambulances. Prior to the change, a rising number of calls for EMS service necessitated calls for mutual aid (back-up assistance from other towns).



Nearly two years since its inception, the increased EMS service has been a great success and has largely eliminated calls for mutual aid. The Village was also fortunate to be able to keep the same EMS staff members after contracting with the new company.



Police Department Reminders

Lock Valuables inside Vehicles

The Police Department reminds residents to lock their car doors and remove valuables from sight; a number of car burglaries have occurred that are simply crimes of opportunity. Offenders look for cars that have been left unlocked and steal anything of potential value. In some cases, offenders have broken windows to remove items of value left in plain view.

Do Not Give Out Personal Information

Do not give out personal information or agree to send money when dealing with unknown people over the internet or on the telephone. Phone calls promising award winnings or free prizes after you have sent shipping costs or tax are likely attempts to take your money. If you have been the victim of internet fraud or identity theft, make a police report. Also, visit www.protectyouridnow.org for tips on protecting your identity.

Don't Block Sidewalk with Your Vehicle

When parking in your driveway, please do not block the sidewalk. This can be especially dangerous in bad weather if pedestrians must walk in the street to get around the vehicle. Village Ordinance prohibits blocking more than half the width of the sidewalk.

Glen Ellyn's rich history is evidenced in its historic streetscapes. The Glen Ellyn Historic Preservation Commission recognizes and supports homeowners and other builders who help preserve the historical fabric of the Village. To recognize these contributions, the Historic Preservation Commission holds an annual awards program. Nominations are accepted through April 1 of each year, and awards are presented in four categories:

The Renovation of the Year Award recognizes outstanding renovations to the exterior of a home or building that maintains architectural integrity and contributes to the preservation of Glen Ellyn history.

The Restoration of the Year Award recognizes outstanding restorations of historic Glen Ellyn homes or buildings in a manner fitting their historic character, while adhering to Glen Ellyn's Historic Preservation Guidelines.

The Streetscape Compatibility Award recognizes outstanding new construction that preserves a neighborhood's architectural style and scale.

The Architectural Details Award recognizes outstanding efforts to restore an exterior detail element of a home or building in a manner fitting its historic character.

Residents are encouraged to nominate projects of special interest in their neighborhoods. Glen Ellyn Senior Center Offers Wide Variety of Resources

The Glen Ellyn Senior Center, located at Grace Lutheran Church, 493 Forest Avenue, provides a variety of services to seniors in Glen Ellyn as well as their families.

Ride DuPage is a subsidized transportation program for residents of Glen Ellyn. Transportation is provided by a combination of taxicabs and small Pace buses. The fare is \$1 per flag pull and \$1 per mile. Riders may travel anywhere in DuPage County, 24 hours/day, 7 days/week. Applicants must be at least 65 years of age, or if under 65, have a documented disability, and reside within the Village of Glen Ellyn. There are no income requirements for this program.

In addition, the Glen Ellyn Senior Center is a SHIP (Senior Health Insurance Program) site. Assistance is

available by appointment for help with Medicare and other insurance issues, and for filing Circuit Breaker applications.



Seniors can also sign up for free cell phones through the Safelink program at the Senior Center, if they meet the required guidelines. Other senior services include a free monthly newsletter with information about local activities for seniors, articles of interest, recipes and word games; free monthly blood pressure screenings; activities and programs for seniors throughout the year; and information and referral services.

2011 Street Rehabilitation Program

The following roadway and storm sewer improvements will take place during the 2011 construction season. For more information, please call the Public Works Department at 630-469-6756.

STREET RECONSTRUCTION - Complete rebuilding of the roadway with either concrete or asphalt.

TYPE IA RESURFACING - Spot curb repairs; removal and replacement of asphalt surface.

TYPE IB RESURFACING - More extensive spot curb repairs; removal and replacement of asphalt surface.

TYPE IC RESURFACING - Curb installation or replacement on one side only; base repair; replacement of asphalt surface; special drainage or construction considerations.

TYPE II RESURFACING - Enhanced roadway repair efforts featuring total curb and driveway approach replacement, a greater level of base repair than Type I, and removal and replacement of the asphalt surface.

- Spring rains can cause **storm water runoff and flooding problems**. To avoid potential damage to your or your neighbor's property, new landscaping and paving work should be designed to avoid or control runoff problems. For this reason, a building permit is now required for the addition or replacement of over 100 square feet of hard surface pavement on your property, or a change to the grade for an area over 300 square feet. If the submitted construction plan may contribute to storm water problems, the permit plan review will include options and suggestions for revisions.
