## Village Focuses on Economic Development

The Village recognizes that the future economic well-being of the community is critical to its ongoing success. Economic development is the engine that drives growth and provides much-needed sales tax revenue to fund Village services and capital improvements, resulting in vibrant and diverse residential and commercial districts.

Economic development steps already taken by the Village include:

- Creation of Economic Development Vision, Mission, Goals and Metrics
- Economic Development Incentive Guidelines
- Expanding facade and retail grant programs

- A stewardship plan for publicly owned assets, such as 810 N. Main Street, the Glen Ellyn History Park, Manor Woods and the Village Links
- A Tax Increment Financing District for downtown

In 2012, the Village will embark on a number of additional projects to support its economic development efforts, including:

- Maintenance and appearance improvements along Roosevelt Road and in the downtown
- Streamlined business development and new business processes and procedures
- Attraction signage

- Aggressive marketing of the former Marathon gas station property at Historic Stacy's Corners, as well as the Roosevelt Glen properties at 799 Roosevelt Road
- Grant-funded parking and streetscape studies
- Expanded connectivity and walkability throughout the Village

To assist in its economic development efforts, the Village will be adding the position of Economic Development Coordinator.

It is anticipated that all of these steps taken together will help to build more vibrant business districts.

## Village Board Adopts FY12/13 Budget

The Village Board recently approved the fiscal year 2012/2013 budget with total net revenues of \$41.7 million and net expenditures of \$43.5 million in its 14 different funds for all operations, debt, and capital investment. Critical capital projects have been planned for this year resulting in the overall budget gap.

The General Fund pays for a majority of the Village's operations, including public safety, snow removal and forestry. This fund projects revenues of \$16.4 million and expenditures of \$16.25 million, leaving a surplus of about \$147,000.

This year's budget continues the Village's commitment to maintain its infrastructure. The largest capital project will be Hawthorne Boulevard reconstruction, including water and sewer improvements. Large capital projects are often funded from current revenues and savings. Capital funding, therefore, fluctuates over the years with some years planned as a deficit and others planned as a surplus.

## Village and Union Pacific Celebrate Partnership



As part of its 150th anniversary celebration, Union Pacific Railroad has awarded membership in its Train Town USA Registry to the Village of Glen Ellyn.

This award is indicative of the Village's longstanding partnership with the railroad since it first arrived in 1849.

The official designation as Train Town USA took place at the March 26 Village Board Meeting. Also at the Board Meeting, the Village Board presented a proclamation to Union Pacific in appreciation for the installation of new fencing on the south side of the railroad tracks. The new fencing is more compatible with the fabric of the downtown and also adds improved safety for commuters.

The Village and Union Pacific look forward to a mutually successful and longstanding partnership, which will continue to serve the needs of our community well into the future.

## Improvements at Panfish Park

Panfish Park has benefited from numerous recent improvements to this valuable community resource. The Village Arboretum within the park was reopened and many trees were identified with tags. Improvements were made to the grounds of Panfish Park, as well, to make it more accessible for a wide variety of activities.

The Village also officially unveiled an outdoor sculpture known as Conduit 15 at Panfish Park during the recent Arbor Day event on May 12. The Conduit 15 artwork, created by local sculptor Mike Baur, was donated by College of DuPage following their renovation and rebuilding project. An anonymous donation paid for the moving and landscaping costs.

During the Arbor Day ceremony, the Village also planted a tree to honor past Village Presidents.

## Village Accepting Applications for Community Grant Program

The Village's Community Grant Program was established to enhance the community's quality of life by offering grant funding for local not-for-profit organizations that provide critical services to Glen Ellyn residents. Grants may support a range of programs related to education, social services, physical and mental health, safe and positive living environments, environmental and natural resources, community events and arts. To be eligible for the program, organizations must be non-profit organizations and provide direct services to the residents of the Village of Glen Ellyn. ## Watering Restrictions Begin May 15

The Illinois Department of Natural Resources mandates that water conservation measures be undertaken between May 15 and September 15. The regulations allow odd-numbered street addresses to water lawns on odd-numbered calendar days, while even-numbered street addresses may water on days that have an even-numbered calendar date. Lawn sprinkling on this odd/even schedule may only be performed from 5 to 8 a.m. and 7 to 11 p.m. Questions about sprinkling should be directed to the Public Works Department at 630-469-6756.

## Garage Sale and Real Estate Signs

Residents are reminded that there are regulations concerning garage sale and real estate signs. These signs may only be displayed on private property (i.e. between the sidewalk and the residence). No signs are permitted in the public parkway. Signs in the parkway may be removed and discarded by Village personnel.

Garage sale signs should not exceed four square feet and should only be displayed on the day of the sale — up to three days. Real estate signs advertising property for sale or lease should not be more than five feet in height and must be removed within seven days after the sale, rental or lease has been executed. No more than one sign is permitted per lot, except corner lots where one sign per street front is permissible.


## Conserve Water, Save Money with Rain Barrels

Rain Barrels, priced from about \$75 and up, can be purchased at a variety of Glen Ellyn businesses. - ❖ **The deadline for vehicle sticker and dog license renewals was April 30.** Beginning May 1, the cost of a sticker will increase by \$5 per month for each vehicle that has an expired registration. Failure to display a current sticker may result in a fine of \$50. - ❖ Be sure to **water private property and parkway trees** during dry conditions. While lawns will usually come back after periods of drought, trees needing water are more likely to die off, if not right away, within a period of several years.
- ❖ If you experience a **power outage**, please contact ComEd at 800-334-7661.
- ❖ To help maintain the peace and tranquility of our neighborhoods, residents are asked to minimize the use of **yard maintenance equipment**, especially after 7 p.m. Please be aware, too, that the noise from yard maintenance equipment carries a long way anytime it is used. When purchasing new equipment, please consider options with sound-dampening capabilities.
- ❖ As students begin their summer vacations, residents are reminded that the **curfew for children under 17** years of age is 11 p.m., Sunday to Thursday, and midnight on Friday and Saturday. Parents are responsible for ensuring that their children meet these curfew regulations.
- ❖ Remember that **dogs must be restrained** in some manner, such as a leash, when not on the owner's property. Village ordinance also requires that dog owners clean up after their pets on public and private property, sidewalks and parkways. In addition, all dogs must be registered with the Cashier's Office (630-547-5235).
