




Village Makes Progress on Downtown Plan

Since its adoption in October of 2009, the Downtown Strategic Plan has been an important focus for the Village of Glen Ellyn. Many Village projects have resulted from these recommendations, including:

- In early 2012, a tax increment financing (TIF) district was approved for the downtown. The money generated from the TIF will help fund future improvements.
- The Village recently hired a new Economic Development Coordinator with a goal of attracting new businesses. In 2012, the downtown was fortunate to have an influx of new businesses, ranging from restaurants to specialty retail shops and services.
- Village grants of up to \$15,000 have assisted businesses with the cost of upgrading building façades and making interior building improvements for new retail uses.
- A \$50,000 grant was secured to complete a downtown streetscape and parking study, which is currently underway and should be complete by June of 2013. The plan will include recommendations for streetscape improvements, such as landscaping, sidewalk treatments, crosswalk enhancements and bike racks. The parking study will focus on parking management strategies and possible locations for a new parking garage.

- A consultant was recently hired to complete a cohesive wayfinding signage plan for the Village with unified designs and recommendations for directional, informational, parking and other signage.
- Using grant money, the Village recently purchased property just west of the downtown core on Duane Street in order to construct a new commuter parking lot on the site, adding an estimated 50 new commuter parking spaces.
- The Village has been working to establish two historic districts in the downtown with formal consideration anticipated in 2013. These

property owners could use to make building improvements.

- The Alliance of Downtown Glen Ellyn undertook a branding study that resulted in a new logo, banners and image for the downtown.
- A new sidewalk was constructed on the south side of Crescent Boulevard near Glenbard West High School in order to improve pedestrian connectivity near and around the downtown.
- A Process Improvement Team consisting of three Village residents, was established to identify process improvements, code revisions and/or educational opportunities to help advance the process for new business openings.


Village Links Course Open During Renovation

Local Landmark Designation: 716 Crescent Boulevard

The Village Board approved landmark designation for the property at 716 Crescent Boulevard. This property, constructed in 1913, is a Prairie style frame and stucco home designed by the world-renowned firm of Frank Lloyd Wright. The home features several elements common in Wright homes, including leaded glass windows, balconies and an enclosed veranda with a stone fireplace. The windows are clad with individual red, green, and yellow panes, resembling those installed in the historic Avery Cooney School in Downers Grove. In addition to its Wright connection, the structure is largely the same as when originally constructed and represents a unique interpretation of a style prominent during that era.

Your home may be eligible for landmarking. Residents are encouraged to apply to have their home landmarked if it is largely unchanged and represents an architectural type or style distinguished by innovation, rarity, uniqueness or overall quality of design, detail, materials or craftsmanship. Hawthorne Corridor Improvements Project Named APWA's Project of the Year

The Village's Hawthorne Corridor Improvements project, completed in the fall of 2012, has been awarded "Project of the Year" by the Suburban Branch of the American Public Works Association (APWA). The difficulties presented by the project were a major consideration in the APWA award.

Hawthorne Boulevard runs from the Village's western border at Hadley Junior High, to the eastern border of Glenbard West High School and is a collector street with a higher than normal traffic volume. The distressed roadway required full reconstruction, although closure of the road near either school while in session was not possible. The result was a major improvement that accomplished all of the stated commitments within a very aggressive timeframe.

Because the judges in this prestigious competition are APWA engineers themselves, it is a high honor and a reaffirmation that the quality of work maintains a high standard as judged by the experts. The Hawthorne Improvements award was in the category of transportation projects with a scope of work under \$5 million.

The Hawthorne Improvements Project highlights included:

- Complete reconstruction of over one mile of Hawthorne Boulevard.
- Two preliminary designs of the proposed road at different widths (21 vs. 25 feet).
- Continuous coordination with Glen Ellyn's two largest schools — Hadley Junior High to the west and Glenbard West High school to the east, together with School Districts 41 and 87 and the City of Wheaton.
- Coordination with ComEd to relocate utility poles.
- Replacement or extension of 1,800 feet of water main and services.
- Installation of over 5,400 feet of new storm sewer.
- Installation of 800 feet of new sanitary sewer and the replacement of all existing services.
- Public meetings and online communications for residents.
- New concrete sidewalk.

Congratulations to the Village's expert Public Works Department members who made this achievement possible.

Electric Aggregation Takes Effect

Village residents approved a municipal electric aggregation program for Glen Ellyn last November that is designed to reduce electric supply costs by approximately 40 percent. The agreement, with Verde Energy USA, is guaranteed for 18 months and includes 100 percent green energy (renewable energy certificates). Verde is an independent electric supply company based in Norwalk, CT.

Effective February 2013 (seen on March bills), this program will provide Village residents with a lower electricity supply rate on their monthly bill. ComEd will continue to bill all residents on a monthly basis, and continue to be the utility provider delivering electricity to homes. Residents should continue to call ComEd in case of an outage or service need.

The Village's electricity supply rate is 4.981 cents per kilowatt-hour, compared to ComEd's rate of 8.802 cents. To compare these rates and see how much you will save under the new program, go to www.mycomedbill.com. For more information, please visit www.glenellyn.org.

Economic Development Corner

Village Continues Commitment to Economic Development



By partnering with local businesses, the Village helped to launch this new redevelopment project underway at Roosevelt Road and Main Street.

As part of its commitment to fostering economic growth in Glen Ellyn, the Village has been working closely with two local businesses to facilitate their planned expansions.

Oberweis Dairy

Last October, the Village Board approved a number of zoning issues to accommodate a new Oberweis Dairy location at the southeast corner of Roosevelt Road and Main Street. Oberweis was formerly located on Roosevelt Road just east of Park Boulevard. In addition to zoning approvals, the Village Board approved a Façade Improvement Grant of \$15,000.

The project involves an extensive renovation of the property and will also include a Connie's Pizza and That Burger Joint, offering a variety of dining options with a drive-thru.

Haggerty Chevrolet

The Chevrolet dealership at 300 West Roosevelt Road will be undergoing \$1.5 million in façade and facility improvements over the next 15 months. These improvements will enhance their business and strengthen the Roosevelt Road commercial corridor.

Historic Preservation Commission Awards

The Glen Ellyn Historic Preservation Commission recognizes and supports homeowners and other builders who help preserve the historic fabric of the Village. To recognize these contributions, the Historic Preservation Commission holds an annual awards program. Nominations are accepted January 1 through April 1 of each year, and awards are presented in four categories:

The Renovation of the Year Award recognizes outstanding renovations to the exterior of a home or building that maintains architectural

integrity and contributes to the preservation of Glen Ellyn history.

The Restoration of the Year Award recognizes outstanding restorations of historic Glen Ellyn homes or buildings in a manner fitting their historic character, while adhering to Glen Ellyn's Historic Preservation Guidelines.

The Streetscape Compatibility Award recognizes outstanding new construction that preserves a neighborhood's architectural style and scale.

The Renovation of the Year Award recognizes outstanding renovations to the exterior of a home or building.

The Architectural Details Award recognizes outstanding efforts to restore an exterior detail element of a home or building in a manner fitting its historic character.

Vehicle Sticker and Dog License Renewals

Vehicle sticker fees help to pay for the maintenance of Village roadways and other capital improvements. The 2013 vehicle stickers must be purchased and displayed by midnight, Tuesday, April 30. For all vehicles registered to a Glen Ellyn address, including leased vehicles, company cars and vehicles kept outside of the Village, you are required to purchase and display a current Glen Ellyn vehicle sticker.

Dog licenses also must be purchased by April 30. Applications are included with the vehicle sticker renewal form sent to all households.

Be Prepared for Heavy Storms

Floods can happen quickly. Preparation before disaster occurs is key. Following are some suggestions for preparing and also preventing obstructions that contribute to flooding.

- Keep storm sewer inlets and drainage ditches clear of debris, including leaves and grass clippings.
- Make sure your sump pump is working. Consider a battery backup unit.
- Monitor potential flood hazards on an All Hazards NOAA Weather Radio, local radio or television or on the internet at www.noaawatch.gov/floods.php.
- Copy your most important papers (mortgage papers, deeds, passport, bank and credit card information). Keep the copies in your home and place the originals outside your home in a secure place like a safety deposit box.
- Go through your basement (if not your entire house) and take photos of your most valuable possessions (furniture, musical instruments and electronic equipment). Store these photos with your other papers.
- Save and store receipts for any expensive household items, such as appliances and electronics, so you have proof of their original cost.
- Assess your flood risk and make sure you have adequate flood insurance coverage.

Floodplain Questions?

You can get help determining whether your property is in the floodplain from the Planning and Development Department at the Glen Ellyn Civic Center or by phone at (630) 547-5250. Copies of the Flood Insurance Rate Maps are also available at the Glen Ellyn Public Library and online at www.fema.gov. Enter "Map Service Center" in the search box. Additionally, the Planning and Development Department has elevation certificates on file for buildings constructed in the floodplain.

Flood Insurance Available

Most homeowners' policies do not cover flood losses. Since Glen Ellyn participates in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), you can protect your home and contents by purchasing a flood insurance policy. You should obtain coverage for structure and contents since there can be more damage to the contents than the structure. Renters can also buy contents coverage even if the owner does not insure the structure.

Don't wait for the next flood to buy insurance protection. There is a 30-day waiting period before the policy becomes effective. To find out more about flood insurance, contact any licensed insurance agent or broker — the same person who sells your home and auto policies. All agencies charge the same premiums. You may be denied federal assistance after a disaster if you don't have flood insurance.

Visit the Glen Ellyn Public Library at 7 p.m. on Wednesday, March 20, for a presentation by Jim Kleinwachter, Land Preservation Specialist for the Conservation Foundation, who will explain how your yard can easily be improved to help reduce water run-off, increase wildlife habitat and improve the soil. He will also discuss strategies for reducing your water use, creating a habitat for birds and butterflies, reducing chemical use, mowing less and eradicating invasive plant species.

Participants will learn about Glen Ellyn's collaboration with the Conservation Foundation to offer the Conservation @ Home certification program which recognizes property owners that protect and/or create yards that are environmentally friendly and conserve water. Participants will also learn how to use rain barrels, rain gardens and native plants to solve yard problems, and will receive a butterfly identification guide and native plant list. 2013 Street Rehabilitation Program

The 2013 Street Rehabilitation Program features five projects consisting of more than 2.5 miles of roadway improvements ranging from simple resurfacing to complete reconstruction and bridge repair. Each roadway project will include varying amounts of underground water, sanitary sewer and storm sewer upgrades, as well as sidewalk, curb & gutter, driveway approach and roadway surface enhancements. Project construction typically will be underway in the spring of 2013 and be completed in the fall, except for the Lenox-Linden project, scheduled to begin in mid-July 2013.

Types of Rehabilitation

FULL RECONSTRUCTION - Complete rebuilding of the roadway with either concrete or full-depth asphalt

TYPE IA RESURFACING - Limited curb repairs; removal and replacement of asphalt surface

TYPE IB RESURFACING - More extensive spot curb repairs; removal and replacement of asphalt surface

TYPE IC RESURFACING - Curb installation or replacement on one side only; base repair; replacement of asphalt surface; special drainage or construction considerations

TYPE II RESURFACING - Full curb replacement; most driveway approaches will be replaced; more extensive parkway restoration; removal and replacement of asphalt surface

TYPE IIA RESURFACING - Full curb replacement; most driveway approaches will be replaced; more extensive parkway restoration; removal and replacement of asphalt surface; and complete replacement of the roadway base

Volcano Mulching Awareness Campaign Starting this Spring

This spring, the Environmental Commission in collaboration with the Public Works Department, will be placing placards around the Village to raise awareness about volcano mulching. Mulching is one of the most important horticultural practices for helping new trees and shrubs get established and keep them healthy. Mulch helps conserve soil moisture, moderate soil temperatures, reduce competition from roots of weeds and turf, and facilitate penetration of water to the roots of woody plants. A common mulching practice now being used by some landscapers is “volcano” mulching, where mulch is piled up the trunk to form a volcano shape. This can have serious negative effects on plant health, such as uprooting, increased risk of root stress, vulnerability to fungal diseases and bark decay.
