


Village of Glen Ellyn Tree Replacement Program



Glen Ellyn values its urban forest. Trees beautify our community, clean the air and enhance our investments. The parkway location at your home is on the list for a new tree to be planted. The village arborist has determined that there is room for a _____-sized tree in the parkway at your address. There are three options for planting trees in the parkway:

- 1. Private:** After calling the Village Public Works Department at 630-469-6756 and securing an approved permit, you may hire a qualified contractor to plant a tree in the parkway at your own expense. The person or company digging and planting the tree must call JULIE at 1-800-892-0123--please be aware of underground utilities in the parkway and the dangers of excavating near them. Replacement can be immediate with this option.
- 2. Village:** The Village selects the species and replaces the tree in the order in which it was removed as part of its annual tree replacement program. There is no direct cost to you. Tree removals have outpaced annual tree planting due to the prevalence of Emerald Ash Borer and severe storms. As a result, we estimate is that it may take 2 to 3 years for the Village to replace a tree that has been removed. - 3. Cost-Share:** Participating in the Resident Cost-Share Parkway Planting Program will allow you to move tree replacement to the next available planting season and you have the opportunity to select the species of tree using the attached application. A maximum of sixty cost-share applications will be accepted each planting season. A limited number of each species is available; please indicate 1st, 2nd and 3rd choices. Other tree species choices will be considered based on location and parkway compatibility.

Small Choices:



FLOWERING DOGWOOD

Upright, rounded form; golden flowers in spring; small cherry-like fruit; dark green foliage changing to reddish purple in fall; full sun or part shade; medium growth rate; 20'-25' tall and 15' wide



COCKSPUR HAWTHORN

Broad-rounded thornless form; white spring flowers; deep red ½" fruit persisting into fall; lustrous foliage changing to bronzed to purplish-red in fall; slow to medium growth rate; 20'-30' tall and 20'-35' wide. *Spring planting only.*



SERVICEBERRY

Rounded form; white flower clusters in early spring; tiny red berry-like fruit provides food of birds; handsome silvery-gray bark; brilliant orange to red fall color; prefers full sun; medium growth rate; 20' tall, 20' wide.



CRABAPPLE

Pink or white flowers in spring; dark green foliage turning yellow in fall; tiny fruit persisting into winter; prefers full sun; medium growth rate; 18'-20' tall, 12-25' wide.



TREE LILAC

Rounded, dense form; sturdy and compact; abundant white flowers in June; dark green leaves; attractive cherry-like reddish-brown bark; mildew resistant; prefers full sun; medium growth rate; 20' tall, 15' wide.

Medium Choices:



AMERICAN HORNBEAM

Graceful, rounded form; dark green foliage changing to yellow-orange in fall; smooth, bluish-gray bark; does well in wet soils; prefers partial shade and rich, deep, moist soil; slow growing; 20'-30' tall and wide. *Spring planting only.*



SILVER LINDEN

Broad, pyramidal form; dense foliage provides excellent shade; lustrous dark green leaves with silvery undersides; fragrant summer flowers; handsome smooth, grayish bark; prefers moist soil and full sun; medium growth rate; 50' tall and 25' wide



TURKISH FILBERT

Broad, pyramidal form, stately and handsome; heavily textured dark green foliage turns yellow to purple in fall; tolerant of adverse conditions; prefers full sun; medium growth rate; 40'-50' tall, 35' wide



LITTLELEAF LINDEN

Dense, tight, pyramidal form; compact foliage provides excellent shade; fragrant, tiny yellowish-white flowers in early summer; yellow fall color; does well under difficult conditions; medium growth rate; 50' tall and 35' wide.



OHIO BUCKEYE

Rounded form; dense foliage provides excellent shade; large greenish-yellow flower spikes in spring; yellow or occasionally orange-red to reddish brown fall color; prefers full sun to partial shade; medium growth rate; 40' tall and wide.

ENGLISH OAK

Broadly rounded form; dark green leaves turning brown in fall; adaptable to wide range of soil types and urban conditions; prefers full sun; slow to medium growth rate; 60'-80' tall and 50'-70' wide. *Spring planting only*



HYBRID HACKBERRY

Oblong to vase-shaped form; smooth, bright green foliage with yellow fall color; small round berries turning purple and attractive to wildlife; very adaptable; full sun; medium to fast growing; 40'-60' tall and wide. *Spring planting only.*



LONDON PLANETREE

Open, wide spreading form; yellow fall color; handsome mottled, peeling bark; adaptable to a wide range of soil types and urban conditions; full sun to light shade; medium growth rate; 60' tall and 50' wide. *Spring planting only*



HYBRID ELM

Glossy, dark green foliage turns a rich golden yellow in fall; disease resistant hybrid; medium growth rate; 55'-70' tall, 40'-50' wide.



YELLOW BUCKEYE

Upright, oval form; yellow flower clusters in spring; dark green foliage turns a pumpkin color in the fall; bark is an attractive combination of gray and brown with large smooth flat plates; very handsome tree; medium growth rate; 60'-75' tall and 50' wide.



KENTUCKY COFFEETREE

Oval form; small, glossy bluish-green leaves provide light shade; yellow fall color; leathery pods; male clone; unique bark pattern; very adaptable and disease resistant; full sun; medium growth rate; 60'-75' tall and 40'-50' wide.

Narrow Choices:



COLUMNAR HACKBERRY

Narrow form; smooth, bright green foliage with yellow fall color; small round berries turning purple and attractive to wildlife; very adaptable to heat, drought and cold; full sun; medium to fast growing to 45' tall and 12' wide. Available exclusively for Spring planting.



COLUMNAR ENGLISH OAK

Upright, columnar form; dark green foliage changes to brown in fall; deeply furrowed bark; prefers full sun and well-drained soil; slow to medium growth rate to 50'-60' tall and 10'-15' wide. Available exclusively for Spring planting.



COLUMNAR GINKGO

Pyramidal form; fruitless male clone; unique bright green fan-shaped leaves change to an excellent yellow in fall; pest-free; prefers full sun; slow to medium growth rate; 60'-70' tall; 20'-30' wide.



COLUMNAR HONEYLOCUST

Tight, narrow form with upright branching; deep green, finely textured foliage and yellow fall color; 45' tall and 20' wide.
