Village Breaks Ground for New Police Station



Village Board Breaks Ground for Glen Ellyn's New Police Station

The Village of Glen Ellyn broke ground for its new 29,000 sq. ft., state-of-the-art police station in July.

The two-story facility will be sited adjacent to Panfish Park, just south of the intersection of Park Boulevard and Taft Avenue. Once complete, the police station will move from its current location on the lower level of the Civic Center at 535 Duane Street.

Following nearly four years of space needs analysis and design work, the new police station was planned to accommodate the state-of-the-art technologies, equipment and system requirements available to support modern-day law enforcement activities.

Some important features include special design elements for safe and efficient intake and housing of prisoners; improved property and evidence storage; a community room for gatherings with area residents, educational sessions and community meetings; added security for the public, as well as employees; and an

emergency operations center (EOC) that can be used for training, larger meetings and major criminal investigations. The new police station will also serve as a centralized meeting point in the event of severe weather or other community emergencies.

The cost of construction for the new police station is \$13.5 million. The project is funded primarily through low interest bonds that will be repaid through current tax revenue collected to fund capital expenses, including streets, sidewalks, alleys and stormwater improvements. Anticipated construction completion is September 2017.

Panfish Park will also see a number of upgrades following construction, including a new parking lot and improvements to lighting, pedestrian and bicycle access, signage, paths and landscaping.

541 Main Street

The Remodeling Project of the Year Award is presented in recognition of an outstanding effort to remodel the exterior of a home or building in a manner maintaining or improving the architectural integrity and contributing to the preservation of Glen Ellyn history. This year's winners in the residential category were 541 N. Main Street and 601 Western Avenue. The Commercial Remodeling Project of the Year Award went to Dunkin Donuts, 1090 Roosevelt Road.

Award recipients were recognized at a Village Board Meeting and also received a certificate and yard sign showcasing their award.

Replacing Expired Smoke Detectors Theme of Fire Prevention Week, Oct. 9-15

"Don't Wait: Check the Date! Replace Smoke Alarms Every 10 Years" has been selected as the official theme for this year's Fire Prevention Week campaign, October 9-15, 2016. A recent National Fire Protection Association survey revealed that only a small percentage of people know how old their smoke alarms are or how often they need to be replaced. Many homes likely have smoke alarms past their expiration date, putting people at increased risk in the event of a home fire. In fact, 21 percent of home fire deaths result from fires in properties without smoke alarms.

Wastewater Treatment Facility Recognized for Excellence

The Glenbard Wastewater Authority operates the primary wastewater treatment facility serving Glen Ellyn and Lombard. For its work in 2015, the wastewater treatment facility recently received two distinguished awards. The facility received the George W. Burk, Jr. Safety Award from the Central States Water Environment Association (CSWEA) and the Clean Water Award from The Conservation Foundation.

The Authority was recognized for many of its efforts in the past year, including public outreach activities. During 2015, the Authority provided informational tours of their facility, laboratory and their Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) System, which monitors water transport, distribution and treatment. The Authority also worked closely with local schools to educate students about water conservation.

The Glenbard Wastewater Authority recently launched their new website www.gbww.org. The site offers a variety of information about the inner workings of the award-winning wastewater treatment facility. Viewers can easily navigate the site to find information about the Authority's facilities and their mission of wastewater treatment – protecting public health and the environment. Additionally, the site offers the community an easy method to receive alerts, information and general news by signing up for their mailing list. ■



The Glenbard Wastewater Authority was created in 1977 by an intergovernmental agreement between the Village of Lombard and the Village of Glen Ellyn for the purpose of jointly constructing and operating an advanced wastewater treatment facility. The current facility opened in 1982 and operates 24 hours per day, 365 days a year removing pollutants and recovering resources from an average daily flow of approximately 12 million gallons of wastewater.

Candidates Sought for Village Offices

The Civic Betterment Party, a non-partisan organization, is now accepting applications from potential candidates seeking seats on the Village and Library Boards for the spring 2017 elections. Candidates are urged to submit their applications for the open offices of Village President, Village Clerk, three Village Trustee positions and three Library Board positions. The nominating committee in Glen Ellyn will accept applications through the end of October.

On Saturday, December 3, the Civic Betterment Party will hold a Town Hall Meeting at the Glen Ellyn Civic Center. At this

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time, residents can cast their vote. Those individuals with the most votes at the Town Hall Meeting and through early voting will be on the ballot in the April 2017 election with Civic Betterment Party endorsement. Early voting will be scheduled during the week

prior to the Town Hall Meeting. Residents are encouraged to attend the Meeting to cast their vote in December, as well as in April when the slate of candidates comes up for formal election.

Base Cost Remains Unchanged for Updated Refuse Rates

In June 2016, the Village Board approved updated rates for the weekly residential solid waste program through Republic Services. While the base rates remained unchanged, the recycling rebate was lowered from \$0.08 to \$0.00 cents due to continued poor performance of the recycling market. Last Branch and Brush Pick-Up for 2016

October will be the final month for Branch and Brush Pick-Up for 2016. Residents should note that the week of October 10-14 will be the last pick-up for Hill Ave and north of Hill Ave; while the week of October 17-21 will be the last week for residents living south of Hill Ave. The Village encourages residents to comply with the following specifications for pick-up:

- ✓ No stickers needed
- ✓ Branch and brush must be out at the curb by 7 a.m. on the Monday of collection
- ✓ Material should NOT be bundled or put in containers
- ✓ Branches may not exceed 10 inches in diameter
- ✓ No root balls or dimensional lumber
- ✓ Professionally cut trimmings are not included

Non-compliant piles will be tagged to identify the reason they were not picked up. Piles that are not picked up will need to be disposed of in a future regular refuse collection, using bags and stickers. The Branch and Brush program will resume in May 2017. Reminder: Fall Leaves

It is illegal to rake leaves into the street, a practice that clogs storm drains and can create slippery conditions for drivers and cyclists. Whenever possible, please clear stormwater grates in your neighborhood of leaves and debris to aid stormwater runoff. Please bag and sticker or compost leaves with your lawn mower.

Aggregation Price for Electricity Reduced

Village residents and eligible small businesses should see lower electric bills due to an agreement with the Village's electrical supplier, FirstEnergy Solutions Corp, which began in July 2016. As part of the agreement, FirstEnergy will match ComEd's estimated blended rate, thereby reducing the Village's current aggregation price from 7.13¢/KwH to a fixed 6.37¢/KwH. This new rate will be in effect July 2016 through August 2017, when the Village's three-year contract with FirstEnergy expires. As was the case in prior contracts, this contract renewal includes keeping 100 percent green energy with renewable energy certificates (RECs) as part of the overall price. Improved Flood Rating for Glen Ellyn

The National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) Community Rating System (CRS) has notified Glen Ellyn that the Village's flood insurance rating has been changed from a level 8 to a level 7. This is an improvement for the Village and will result in reduced flood insurance premiums.

With this new rating, residents and business owners in the Village's Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA) will receive a 15 percent discount on their flood insurance premiums, while those outside the SFHA will receive a five percent discount. Residents and business owners should contact their insurance agent concerning the effective date for the new rates.

Hill Avenue Bridge Closed through Year-End

The Hill Avenue Bridge over the East Branch of the DuPage River in Western Lombard near Glen Ellyn is under rehabilitation and will be closed to all traffic until late in 2016, with projected completion in December.

Crescent Boulevard has been established as the assigned detour with a signed detour route.

Parameters for the bridge rehabilitation were designed by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) with input from the Villages of Glen Ellyn and Lombard. Eighty percent of the bridge design and construction costs are funded by the State of Illinois.

Links Starts Honeybee Farm

This past spring, Glen Ellyn's Village Links began keeping bees. The bee yard, which includes four colonies, is located adjacent to the greenhouse at the maintenance center. The bees are being raised to produce honey that can be used in menu items and specialty cocktails at Reserve 22 Restaurant located at the Links. Beyond the benefit of producing their own honey, the beekeeping aids in the expansion of the native honey bee population and helps to ensure a healthy ecosystem at the golf course by pollinating thousands of native trees and shrubs. For its commitment to the natural environment, the Village Links was the first public golf course in the world to be fully certified as a wildlife sanctuary by Audubon International.
