



BigBelly Refuse Containers Come to the Downtown

As part of a joint eco-friendly initiative between the Village and the Glen Ellyn Environmental Commission, the Village has rolled out two BigBelly containers, one for refuse and one for recycling, which are located in the downtown.



These solar-powered containers use a compactor to crush the garbage down after a "full" sensor is triggered. As a result, BigBelly containers hold five times as much garbage as a regular can. The larger holding capacity helps prevent refuse overflow and gives the downtown a cleaner look.

The new BigBelly containers are located on the northeast corner of Crescent and Main. The installation of the BigBelly containers is part of a pilot program and the Village will continue to evaluate other locations throughout downtown Glen Ellyn.

Glen Ellyn Completes Fourth Architectural Resources Survey

The Village has conducted an Architectural Resources Survey of the northeast portion of the Village.

This will be the fourth such survey undertaken in the Village over the last 10 years. Each survey has been partially funded by a grant from the Illinois Historic Preservation Agency. The survey has several goals:

- Expansion of the Village's body of data on existing historic homes
- Creation of residential interest in preservation
- Encouragement of homeowner consideration of property landmarking

Of the surveyed homes, 91 were found to be significant or potentially significant homes that contribute to the historic character of the Village and its neighborhoods.

Residents are encouraged to submit their homes for landmarking. Landmarking a home serves several purposes:

- Honoring our historic and cultural heritage
- Encouraging civic pride in the beauty and accomplishments of the past
- Preserving the character and vitality of Village neighborhoods and the central business district
- Encouraging public participation in identifying and preserving historical and architectural resources
- Recognizing properties that contribute to the historic character of the Village
- Encouraging homeowners to apply for placement of their home on the National Registry

There are additional benefits to landmarking properties, including tax benefits to properties for restoration or renovation projects.

Glen Ellyn Volunteer Fire Company Open House, October 4 and 6

The Glen Ellyn Volunteer Fire Company will hold an open house on Saturday, October 4, from 10 a.m. - 1 p.m., and on Monday, October 6, from 7 - 9 p.m., as part of Fire Prevention Week 2014 (October 5-11). Saturday's event will be held at the downtown fire station located at 524 Pennsylvania Avenue, while the Monday evening events will be held at both fire stations: the downtown fire station and the south side fire station at 681 Taft Avenue.

Fire Prevention Week

Fire Prevention Week was established to commemorate the Great Chicago Fire, the tragic 1871 conflagration that killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures and burned more than 2,000 acres. The fire began on October 8, but continued into and did most of its damage on October 9, 1871.

While the Great Chicago Fire was the best-known blaze to start during this fiery two-day stretch, it wasn't



the biggest. That distinction goes to the Peshtigo, WI, fire — the most devastating forest fire in American history. The fire, which also occurred on October 8, 1871, and roared through northeast Wisconsin, burning down 16

Glen Ellyn Signs New 3-Year Electricity Contract

New Rates Still Lower than ComEd

After receiving multiple bids from energy companies through the Electric Aggregation Program, the Village Board has approved a three-year contract with FirstEnergy as the Village's new energy supplier. The new rate, which went into effect on August 1, will be 7.5¢/kwh. Compared to the latest ComEd rates, it is estimated to save the average household about \$30 per year.

ComEd's latest published rate, which fluctuates monthly, is anticipated to average 7.93¢/kwh, which is comprised of the ComEd fixed rate of 7.596¢/kwh, plus a variable fee that has averaged 0.33¢/kwh for the last 36 months. The Village's new contract with First Energy is not subject to the additional variable fee. The Village's former contract with Verde Energy expired on August 1.

The new FirstEnergy contract will continue to promote "green energy" through the purchase of Renewable Energy Certificates (RECs), which will represent 100 percent of the Village's electric energy use.

Residents who do not wish to utilize First Energy as an energy supplier will have the

ability to "opt out" at any time if they wish to select an alternate energy supplier. Those who are currently in the Municipal Electric Aggregation Program for Glen Ellyn, as well as ratepayers currently receiving power supply through ComEd, should have received a letter in the mail from First Energy during the last week of June with details on how to continue participation in the program or to opt-out.

Residents who wish to learn more about their electricity choices and market pricing may visit www.pluginillinois.org. Information regarding the Village's Electric Aggregation Program can be found on the Village's website at www.glenellyn.org.

Residents should be aware of direct calls, mailings, and door-to-door marketing. The Village does not send people door-to-door or call residents to sign up for energy suppliers. Door-to-door marketing requires a peddler's permit. The Village highly encourages residents who choose to select their own

energy provider to initiate first contact with the provider after comparing all rates and options.

Just as before, residents will still continue to receive one monthly bill generated by ComEd, and will continue

to receive electricity delivery services from ComEd. Any outages should continue to be reported directly to ComEd.

towns, killing 1,152 people and scorching 1.2 million acres before it ended.

Help us sound the alarm that working smoke alarms save lives!

The Fire Prevention Week theme for 2014 is "Working Smoke Alarms Save Lives. Test Yours Every Month!"

A properly installed and maintained smoke alarm is the first thing in your home that can alert you and your family to a fire — 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Whether you're awake or asleep, a working smoke alarm is constantly on alert, scanning the air for fire and smoke.

According to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), almost two-thirds of home fire deaths resulted from fires in properties without working smoke alarms. A working smoke alarm significantly increases your chances of surviving a deadly home fire. The NFPA also reported that in fires considered large enough to activate smoke alarms, hardwired alarms operate 93 percent of the time, compared to 79 percent for battery-powered alarms.



Did you know that many people don't test their smoke alarms as often as they should? When there is a fire, smoke spreads fast. You need working smoke alarms to give you time to get out. Test yours every month!

Flood Protection Resources

The Village continues to work to reduce flood risks, but reminds residents that there are ways to protect your home.

The Village has prepared a flood protection brochure, which can be downloaded from the Village website www.glenellyn.org, by clicking on "Village Publications" and then "Residential Drainage Brochure," under the section entitled "Other." Brochures also are available by calling the Planning and Development Department at 630-547-5250. If you have experienced flooding, Planning and Development Department staff can meet with you to discuss flood protection options.

A comprehensive guide entitled "The Homeowner's Guide to Retrofitting: Six Ways to Protect Your House From Flooding" (FEMA Publication 312), is available at the Glen Ellyn Public Library, or online at www.fema.gov. Enter "Homeowner's Guide to Retrofitting" in the search box.

Stormwater Regulations

Many properties have drainage swales, ditches or storm sewers to carry stormwater away from structures. Over time, fences, hedge rows, annual mulching and regrading can block or divert stormwater. Always check with the Planning and Development Department before you build on, grade, excavate or place fill on your property, since it is illegal to obstruct the flow of water directed at your property. A permit may be required to avoid causing problems for you or your neighbors.

Reminder: Permits are required for outside work, including fences, patios, decks, sidewalks and regrading. Always check with the Planning & Development Department at 630-547-5250 before you begin any project.

Village Signs New Paramedic Services Contract

The Village of Glen Ellyn recently contracted with Metro Paramedic Services, Inc., for all ambulance and paramedic services. Previously, the Village maintained its own ambulance fleet and contracted with PSSI for paramedic services only.

This new contract will save the Village \$54,400 annually or \$272,000 over the next five years. In addition, this eliminates from the Village Budget the

unpredictability of costs associated with vehicle maintenance.

The Village has contracted with Metro in the past, a company which has 27 years of

experience providing similar services to other municipalities and districts, including the City of Elmhurst, and the Villages of Mundelein, Roselle and Antioch, as well as the

Warrenville Fire Protection District. The new contract with Metro took effect on June 15.



Glen Ellyn's "Financial Scorecard"

Did you know that the Glen Ellyn Volunteer Fire Company saves Village residents approximately \$3 million per year as compared to the Village's peer communities? The Village's Finance Commission recently updated the Village's "Financial Scorecard," which compares Glen Ellyn to 10 peer communities in areas of property taxes, revenues, expenses, reserves and credit strength. This year's Scorecard also compared current performance to the results seen in the 2010 Scorecard, the first Scorecard completed.


The current Scorecard indicates that Glen Ellyn is in a strong financial position with less debt and lower unfunded pension obligations than

most of its peers. Annual spending per capita on police protection and general administrative expenses is also among the lowest of the peer group. For property taxes on a median value property, Glen Ellyn is in the middle of

the peer group in terms of property taxes going to schools, in the middle of the peer group in terms of property taxes going to the park district, and towards the low end of the peer group in terms of property taxes going to the Village/Library.

Economic revitalization and new development are cited as potential areas to strengthen, which would boost sales tax revenues and generate non-residential property taxes. French Market Offers Greater Variety of Vendors

Glen Ellyn's new French Market has been well received and offers shoppers a more diverse shopping experience, compared to the former Farmers' Market. In addition to produce, flowers and baked goods, the French Market vendors feature jewelry, clothing, accessories, crafts and much more.

The French Market is conveniently open on Sundays, with shopping hours from 8 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. The former Farmers' Market was operated in the Main Street parking lot on Fridays; the new French Market takes place in the Crescent/Glenwood parking lot.

Updated Refuse and Recycling Rates

In July, the Village Board approved updated rates for the weekly residential solid waste program. Rates were updated as part of the Village's five-year contract with Republic Services, which includes an annual adjustment based on the Chicago area Consumer Price Index (1.1 percent).

The rate adjustment also accounts for a reduced monthly recycling rebate caused by current market conditions (new rebate: \$0.23 versus old rebate of \$0.60 per household). The Village will continue to provide information about recycling rates through the weekly eNewsletter and on the website www.glenellyn.org.


Are You Selling Your Home?

Be sure there are no surprises if you decide to sell your home. The following are required by the Village prior to moving:

- A clearwater inspection must be performed in the 90 days prior to the closing of your home. Please contact the Public Works Department to schedule this inspection at 630-469-6756, M-F 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. There is a \$50 fee for the inspection.
- Please notify the Village five days prior to your closing for a final reading of your water, sewer and refuse account by contacting the Cashier's Office at 630-547-5220 or 5221. The final meter reading will be taken the day before the closing. This final bill will be prepared and available for payment after 12 p.m. that day.
- To obtain a Real Estate Transfer Stamp for your property, a signed sales contract or P-Tax contract needs to be presented, which is signed by all parties, together with the Village Real Estate Transfer Tax application. This form is available on the Village website.

The Cashier's Office will need your forwarding address for your final bill or possible refund. To cancel service or for further information, please contact the Cashier's Office at 630-547-5220 or 630-547-5221.

Local Projects Selected for Village's Annual ARC Awards

The Village of Glen Ellyn's Appearance Review Guidelines authorize the Architectural Review Commission (ARC) to present a "Traveling Trophy Design Award" each year. The Trophy Award has been distributed since the Village adopted the original Appearance Guide and Criteria in 1969. This award is "intended to acknowledge excellence in building design."

In 2000, the Village established the Vivian Ball Landscape Award in memory of Vivian Ball who was extremely active in efforts to beautify the Village. The Landscape Award "is intended to acknowledge excellence in achieving the aesthetic landscape objectives of the Village."

The ARC selected Magenium Solutions, located at 535 Pennsylvania Avenue, as having the best overall architectural design for development projects completed between July 2013 and July 2014. Magenium Solutions received the Traveling Trophy Design Award at the Village Board meeting on August 25. The Fresh Market Center, located at 277-293 Roosevelt Road, was the runner-up and will receive a certificate for honorable mention.

For all other forms of yard waste, or for disposing of leaves during other months of the year, please use yard waste stickers (\$2.45). Unlike leaf stickers, yard waste stickers can be used either with reusable bins or Kraft paper bags. Refuse, leaf and yard waste stickers can be purchased from the Cashier's Office or the Police Department (open 24 hours) in the Civic Center (535 Duane Street). In addition, they can be purchased at Jewel/Osco, Len's Ace Hardware and McChesney & Miller.
- ❖ It is illegal to **rake leaves into the street**. This practice clogs storm drains and inlets and can create slippery conditions for drivers and cyclists.
- ❖ Residents can now get **ComEd outage notifications** at www.comed.com/customer-service/outage-information/Pages/default.aspx
- ❖ Daylight savings time ends this year on Sunday, November 2. **Checking smoke detector batteries** in spring and fall when the time changes is a great way to remember this practice that could save a life.
- ❖ **October will be the last month for the monthly branch and brush collection.** October pick-ups will take place:
 - For both sides of Hill Ave. and north of Hill Ave., the second Monday of October, October 13.
 - For south of Hill Ave., the third Monday of October, October 20.
- ❖ **Weekly yard waste collection, with yard waste stickers affixed, will run through the end of November.** Weekly yard waste pick-up, with stickers, will resume in April 2015.
- ❖ **Snowplow drivers are needed for clearing Village streets** in the winter months. To apply, please call the Public Works Department at 630-469-6756.
