### Village Launches Residential Curbside Composting Pilot Program

The Village of Glen Ellyn is always looking for ways to be more environmentally friendly. Effective April 1, the Village instituted a curbside composting program enabling residents to “recycle” food scraps and yard waste that would otherwise be sent to a landfill.

As one of the first communities to adopt the program in DuPage County, Glen Ellyn is offering the pilot program to residents on a voluntary, subscription basis.

Subscribers who use the organics cart for their yard waste and food scraps will only be required to purchase yard waste bags or stickers for yard waste that doesn't fit into the composting cart.



Residents that sign up for the program have the option of selecting from three sizes of wheeled carts — 35-gallon (\$11.31/month), 65-gallon (\$13.40/month) or 95-gallon (\$17.40/month). The program, billed year-round, would coincide with the Village's seasonal yard waste subscription program, which runs April through November.

Residents who participate in the project will receive their chosen cart for the weekly collection of organic matter, together with a small kitchen composting container and an initial supply of bio-degradable bag liners.

### Village Moves Forward With Strategic Plan

The Village of Glen Ellyn's Strategic Plan provides a clear vision for the community over the next several years. In February, the Glen Ellyn Village Board agreed to proceed with the 2016-17 Strategic Plan, which it had completed following several planning sessions held late in 2015. During these sessions, Village leadership reviewed various surveys conducted by key Village stakeholders, including Commission members, the elected Village Board and Village employees. This process formed the basis for the development of the plan.

Six key 2016-17 strategy issues were identified, including development, business, attractions, communications and involvement, infrastructure and financial

sustainability. Each category outlines various goals, as well as action steps for completing these goals.

The Village also recently adopted a new Vision Statement for Glen Ellyn: “The Village of Glen Ellyn is a desirable community in which to live, work and play, with unique character and charm, a small-town feel, urban amenities and a high quality of life.”

Each year, the plan will be reviewed and adjusted with the priorities of the Village Board and integrated with the budget process. Every two years, a realignment process will be completed with the Village Board.

## Glen Ellyn Volunteer Fire Company Seeking New Members

### *Come and Join the Team of Dedicated Volunteers*

Since 1907, the Glen Ellyn Volunteer Fire Company has served the residents of Glen Ellyn, responding to their calls for help night or day. During these 100-plus years, only a few hundred men and women have shown the dedication to be able to wear the Fire Company uniform and serve. These are your neighbors, these are your friends and they all call Glen Ellyn home.

The Fire Company is seeking individuals who have a sense of commitment to our community and are up to the challenge of providing the residents of the Glen Ellyn Fire Protection District with a high level of service.

#### *Eligibility includes:*

- 21 years of age or older.
- Live within one mile of the Fire Protection District boundaries. (Contact the Fire Company if you are unsure.)
- Able to pass a physical and background check, at Fire Company expense.
- Able to perform physically strenuous work.
- Willing to dedicate a substantial amount of time for training during the first 12-18 months while on probationary status.
- Dedicated to serving others as an uncompensated volunteer.

## Sign Up to Receive Critical Information in the Event of an Emergency

The Village recently adopted a new notification system that can communicate potential emergency information to residents and businesses. In addition, the new system enables the Village to identify and only contact residents in close proximity to the emergency.



Examples of how the system might be used include severe weather, major power outages, evacuations with corresponding shelter locations, crime alerts, public health hazards and the like.

Residents can sign up, free of charge, to be contacted through email, cell phone or other phone numbers, such as place of employment. Residents

who do not sign up for the new system will receive notifications only by landline phones registered to addresses in their geographic area. With the implementation of the new alerting system, subscribers to Glen Ellyn's

previous emergency alerting system will need to re-subscribe to the new system in order to continue receiving notifications.

## Upgrades for Pedestrian Crossings

In 2012, the Village retained a consultant to design crosswalk improvements at various intersections controlled by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) in an effort to enhance pedestrian access. The project included the installation of a signalized crosswalk on the west side of the Route 38 (Roosevelt Road) and Nicoll intersection to complement the other three crosswalk legs, as well as an entire intersection improvement at Route 53 and Pershing. In addition, a new fourth crosswalk would be incorporated on the west side of the intersection of Route 38 and Lambert Road.

**The Glen Ellyn Signalized Pedestrian Crossing Improvements Project will provide safer access across Roosevelt Road and Route 53.**

In 2013, the Village learned of a grant opportunity for these pedestrian improvements through the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA) Small

Scale Access to Transit initiative. The project will receive significant federal funding for both construction and engineering expenses, with the balance of costs paid by the Village.



## Lake Ellyn Stormwater Improvements

In conjunction with the Glen Ellyn Park District, the Village is moving forward with a project to improve Lake Ellyn stormwater management capabilities. The project will increase the rate at which water discharges from the lake through underground pipes, reducing the frequency and duration of future overflows like those which occurred in 2008, 2010 and 2013.

On March 21, Village Trustees approved a \$555,000 construction agreement with Batavia-based Earthwerks Land Improve-

ment and Development Corporation for the Lake Ellyn Outlet Control Structure Replacement Project, as it is known. Trustees also approved a \$69,000 agreement with RHMG Engineers, Inc., of Mundelein for construction engineering services.

Work began in April and the project is slated for completion by the end of June in order to be ready for the annual Lake Ellyn Cardboard Regatta on July 2. The work is funded by a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for disaster relief.

## Beware of Flooding Dangers

**DON'T WALK THROUGH FLOWING WATER:** Six inches of moving water can knock you off your feet. Use a stick to check the depth. Don't let children play in water near storm drains or ditches.

**DON'T DRIVE THROUGH FLOODED ROADWAYS:** More people drown in their cars than anywhere else – just two feet of water can lift and move a car. Water depth can be misleading. If your car stalls, abandon it and get to higher ground.

**BE CAREFUL ENTERING A FLOODED BASEMENT:** Electricity travels through water and submerged electrical equipment can cause electrocution. Have the electricity disconnected before entering the basement.

**AVOID POWER LINES AND ELECTRICAL WIRES:** Report downed power lines to your utility company.

**LOOK BEFORE YOU STEP:** After a flood, the ground and floors are often covered with debris. Floors and stairs that have been covered with mud can be very slippery.

**BE ALERT FOR GAS LEAKS:** Standing water can snuff out pilot lights on hot water heaters and furnaces. This can create the risk of an explosion. Call your utility company for help. Do not smoke or use candles, lanterns or open flames until you are sure that the gas has been turned off and the area has been aired out.


**CARBON MONOXIDE EXHAUST KILLS:** Only operate generators or other gasoline-powered machines **OUTDOORS** to protect your family from carbon monoxide exhaust.

**CLEAN EVERYTHING THAT GETS WET:** Floodwaters may have picked up sewage and chemicals. Spoiled food and flooded medicines and cosmetics are health hazards. If in doubt, throw them away.

**BE PREPARED FOR DIFFICULTIES:** Recovering from a flood is a big job and the aftereffects may last awhile. Consult a health professional about how to recognize and care for anxiety, stress and fatigue.

## Public Works to Remove Volcano Mulching

Mulching is one of the most beneficial things that you can do to keep your trees healthy. If performed incorrectly, however, it can also lead to the death of your tree.

Mulching increases soil organic matter, water-holding capacity and nutrient availability. It helps control weeds, protects the tree trunk from being hit by lawn equipment and acts as an insulator to buffer the soil from rapid temperature changes.

To properly apply mulch, place a 2-4-inch saucer-shaped layer at least two to three feet out from the trunk of the tree. Do not pile the mulch up against the trunk. Mulch mounded up against a tree's trunk (known as "volcano mulching") can cause bark rot, which makes the tree vulnerable to disease, insect problems and even death.

Glen Ellyn's community forest is one of the features that makes our community special and we want to do everything possible to protect it. To do so, we ask all homeowners to be attentive to this issue. If you have a tree that is volcano-mulched, please remove the excess mulch and use it in other areas of your garden.

This year, Glen Ellyn Public Works, in collaboration with residents, a contractor and an Eagle Scout, will begin to remove mulch from parkway trees that have been "volcano mulched." In parkways where excessive mulch surrounds the tree trunk, the goal is to reshape the mulch so that it is a safe distance from the trees. In some parkways, however, the mulch is too excessive to be simply reshaped from the tree trunk. This mulch will be removed from the site for the health of the tree. Residents are encouraged to remove the mulch themselves and use it elsewhere. For more information, please contact Public Works at 630-469-6756.

## Glen Ellyn's Safe Drinking Water

Many residents have expressed concerns about the quality of Glen Ellyn's tap water in light of recent news about lead levels in Flint, Michigan's municipal water system. The Village places a high priority on the safety of our drinking water and would like to assure residents that our community is in complete compliance with both U.S. EPA and Illinois EPA lead/copper sampling rules.

In 2014, the Village conducted 30 lead/copper samples as required by the EPA. Of those, 29 detected no lead and one came back as 7.41 ppb lead detected, which is well below the EPA action level of 15 ppb. The Village has received a good rating from the U.S. EPA based on these results. The next EPA-required sampling will take place between July and September 2017.

## One Hundred Years Ago in Glen Ellyn: 1916

In 1916, Glen Ellyn's first four-year high school was accredited by the University of Illinois. The high school's classes met on the second and third stories of the DuPage County State Bank building on the northwest corner of Main and Crescent.

Dr. Frank Johnson was appointed the official Village Forester in 1916. He served the Village well into the 1930s. Besides growing and planting trees at his own expense, he encouraged homeowners to plant trees and gave them advice on how to maintain them.

The Boy Scout movement was founded in Great Britain in 1908 by cavalry officer Lieutenant General Robert S.S. (later Lord) Baden-Powell who had written a book titled Scouting for Boys. In October of 1916, Mr. Orrell helped organize a troop that met in the basement of the Methodist Episcopal Church. Dr. Ensminger assumed leadership after Mr. Orrell moved away from Glen Ellyn on business. The church's first building was on the south side of Hillside Avenue west of Main Street.


